Subject: Notification of Implementer Closure of 2013-2014 Energy Efficiency Portfolio Third Party Subprogram

Purpose

This Advice Letter provides Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E's) notification of the closure of the Small Commercial Comprehensive Refrigeration Program (SCCR) (PGE210116), a third-party (3P) subprogram approved for PG&E's 2013-2014 Energy Efficiency (EE) Portfolio in Decision (D). 12-11-015. The closure was requested by the third-party program implementer, KEMA Services, Inc. (KEMA).

Background

On September 24, 2009, the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission or CPUC) issued D.09-09-047, *Approving 2010-2012 Energy Efficiency Portfolios and Budgets*. The decision states that for the 2010-2012 programs, "the utilities shall not eliminate any program or subprogram except through the advice letter process."¹ This requirement is also included in the Energy Efficiency Policy Manual which applies to post-2012 EE programs.²

Purpose

On February 27, 2014, KEMA informed PG&E of its intention to stop accepting new projects for the SCCR program, as of March 1, 2014, and close all existing projects by March 31, 2014. Due to factors such as decreased claimable savings, higher customer co-payments, increased administrative burden, and greater competition, the program was operating at a loss to the implementer, who was unable to successfully ramp up and build a robust project pipeline in the 2013-14 program cycle. As a result, the

program delivered 9 percent of its kWh savings goal and 10 percent of its kW savings goal in 2013.

KEMA is no longer accepting customer referrals for SCCR and now expects to install all committed projects by March 26, 2014. Projects that require longer lead time will be transferred to other PG&E programs for completion.
