**Subject: Submits Notice of Construction, Pursuant to General Order 131-D, for the Construction of RE Kansas LLC Solar Project Interconnection to the Henrietta-GWF 115kV Power Line, Kings County**

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (“PG&E” or “the Company”) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

**Purpose**

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

**Background**

The developer of the RE Kansas LLC Solar Project in Kings County has requested PG&E to connect the existing Henrietta-GWF 115 Kilovolt (kV) Power Line to the solar project’s customer-owned substation. The substation is located approximately 400 feet northeast of the intersection of Jersey Avenue and 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue. To accommodate the new tap line, which will be approximately 230 feet long, PG&E will replace one existing approximately 57-foot-tall wood pole with three new tubular-steel poles within PG&E’s existing power line easement (existing easement, intersetting additional structures). In order to meet California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC or Commission) General Order 95 minimum clearance requirements and current design standards, the three new poles will be approximately 70 to 85 feet tall. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in August 2014, or as soon as project plans and approvals are in place. Construction will be completed in October 2014, or as soon as possible after construction begins.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1, exempts a utility from the CPUC’s requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct if a project meets specific conditions. This project qualifies for the following exemption(s),

“(c) the minor relocation of existing power line facilities up to 2,000 feet in length, or the intersetting of additional support structures between existing support structures.”

“(g) power line facilities of substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR [Environmental Impact Report] finds no significant unavoidable impacts.”

This filing will not increase any rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

### **Protests**

Anyone wishing to protest this filing may do so by filing a protest with the CPUC and the Company by May 27, 2014, which is 22<sup>1</sup> days after the date of this filing. Protests should be mailed to the following address:
