

Retiree Bar Date FAQ

1. What is a Bar Date?

- The Bar Date is the last day by which Proofs of Claim must be filed if any person or entity believes they are owed money by PG&E for the period prior to the Chapter 11 filing date of January 29, 2019.
- The Bar Date has been set for October 21, 2019, at 5 PM PT.

2. Why did I receive the Bar Date Notice?

- The Bar Date Notice has been sent to all known parties that may potentially be owed money by PG&E, including all retirees and customers.
- Please note that the receipt of this notice does not mean that you have a claim or that PG&E or the Bankruptcy Court believe you have a claim.
- PG&E retirees will not need to file proofs of claims for ordinary course benefit items that arise after the Petition Date because PG&E is continuing its tax-qualified pension plan and health and life insurance benefits.
- Certain employees may need to file claims in connection with their participation in non-qualified benefit plans (for example, PG&E's deferred compensation plan or its supplemental pension plan for executives), and we will communicate with those employees in the coming weeks.
- Additionally, with regard to the Customer Bar Date Notice, you won't need to file claims for deposits, refunds, and other ordinary course billing items in connection with their PG&E account.
- If you are unsure whether you have a claim, you should consult with your own legal counsel.

3. What is a Proof of Claim?

- A "Proof of Claim" is the official form that a creditor or other interested party must submit in order to assert a claim against the Company.

4. I received the Bar Date Notice and Proof of Claim form, does this mean I have a claim?

- Receipt of this notice and proof of claim form does not mean that you have a claim or that PG&E or the Bankruptcy Court believe you have a claim.
- You should only submit a Proof of Claim if you believe you have an unpaid claim that arose before January 29, 2019.
- PG&E retirees will not need to file proofs of claims for ordinary course benefit items that arise after the Petition Date because PG&E is continuing its tax-qualified pension plan and health and life insurance benefits.
- Certain employees may need to file claims in connection with their participation in non-qualified benefit plans (for example, PG&E's deferred compensation plan or its supplemental pension plan for executives), and we will communicate with those employees in the coming weeks.
- Additionally, with regard to the Customer Bar Date Notice, you won't need to file claims for deposits, refunds, and other ordinary course billing items in connection with their PG&E account.
- If you are unsure whether you have a claim, you should consult with your own legal counsel.

5. Do I need to file a Proof of Claim?

- You are strongly urged to file a Proof of Claim if you believe you have an unpaid claim against PG&E that arose before January 29, 2019.
- If you have an unpaid claim relating to the period before January 29, 2019 and you do not file a Proof of Claim by Monday, October 21, 2019, you may not be entitled to receive any payment on your claim once a Chapter 11 Plan is confirmed.
- PG&E retirees will not need to file proofs of claims for ordinary course benefit items that arise after the Petition Date because PG&E is continuing its tax-qualified pension plan and health and life insurance benefits.
- Certain employees may need to file claims in connection with their participation in non-qualified benefit plans (for example, PG&E's deferred compensation plan or its supplemental pension plan for executives), and we will communicate with those employees in the coming weeks.
- Additionally, with regard to the Customer Bar Date Notice, you won't need to file claims for deposits, refunds, and other ordinary course billing items in connection with their PG&E account.

- If you do not believe you have a claim, you do not need to do anything in response to the notice and you do not need to file a proof of claim form.

6. What do I do if I think I have a claim but don't know the amount?

- You are strongly urged to file a Proof of Claim if you believe you have an unpaid claim against PG&E that arose before January 29, 2019, to preserve your rights for recovery on amounts believed owed.
- To the extent you believe you have a claim, but do not know or do not have documentation of the exact amount, you can consult with your own legal counsel, and claims may be filed for an unknown amount.

7. Where and how do I submit my Proof of Claim Form?

- Proofs of Claim may be filed through any of the following methods:

8. I have already filed a proof of claim in these proceedings, must I now file another claim?

- If you have already filed a Proof of Claim in these Chapter 11 cases, you do not need to re-submit your claim at this time.

9. What happens if someone misses the Bar Date deadline to file a claim?

- Any holder of a claim that fails to timely file a Proof of Claim by the Bar Date may be barred from asserting their claims against the Company and may not receive a distribution on account of such claims going forward.
