Work Begins on October 24, 2017

What is the work?

Under the oversight of the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC), Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) will conduct additional field work at the former Napa manufactured gas plant (MGP) site. Work includes:

- Drilling two borings (holes) using a truck-mounted drill rig to collect soil samples;
- Digging seven trenches using a backhoe and/or excavator;
- Periodically testing existing wells on-site and along Riverside Drive to measure groundwater levels;
- Collecting samples for laboratory testing ;
- Transporting contaminated soil to a permitted disposal facility; and
- Backfilling holes/trenches and cleaning up work areas.

When will you see work?

- On-site work will begin on October 24, 2017 and continue for four weeks.
- Work on Riverside Drive will continue during several one-day events through December 2017.
- All work will be conducted during the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

What safety measures will be in place?

- Work will be performed according to a site-specific Health and Safety Plan.
- Measures to minimize potential dust, noise and other impacts will be used.

- Signage and flaggers will be present to safely direct traffic while crews work along Riverside Drive. The road will remain open.

How will the work impact you?

As with all construction work, you may experience some noise.

What are the plans to clean up the site?

PG&E will use the information collected from this work to plan future cleanup activities. A draft cleanup plan will be available for public review in 2018. Cleanup work is tentatively scheduled for 2020.
