## **PG&E Former Manufactured Gas Plants (MGPs) Marina District, San Francisco**

### **Soil and Soil Vapor Sampling on Private Properties: *February 1, 2022 through January 31, 2023***

The California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) oversees a program to sample and, where necessary, clean up former manufactured gas plant (MGP) sites that PG&E historically owned or operated. MGPs produced gas from coal and oil before natural gas was readily available.

#### **What is the work?**

- Upon property owners' request, sampling soil and soil vapor (air between particles of soil) for chemical compounds associated with former MGP sites, including polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs).
- Workers will use hand tools, such as augers and probes, drilling equipment, such as drill rigs and mobile testing equipment to collect samples.

#### **When will you see the work?**

- This work may occur intermittently between February 1, 2022 through January 31, 2023.
- Work will take place on weekdays between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

#### **Who will do the work?**

- PG&E and their contractors will be conducting the work with oversight from DTSC.

#### **How will the work impact you?**

- Sidewalks and parking lanes in front of properties may be partially closed and pedestrians may be redirected.
- There will be temporary noise impacts from drilling activities; work will be conducted according to the San Francisco Noise Control Ordinance. #### **Where will you see the work?**

- Work will take place on private properties where owners have voluntarily granted access, within or next to the former MGP site boundaries (see figure on back page).
