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### **Long-Term Bundled RPS Energy Sale Solicitation Webinar #2 – Questions and Answers**

**Question 1:** Would PG&E be open to evaluating non-conforming offers of 15 to 20-year terms?

**Answer:** For this solicitation, PG&E is only considering 10-year terms.

**Question 2:** Should the counterparty's bid be short-listed, will there be a time to discuss with the counterparty's counsel and PG&E?

**Answer:** If the counterparty's bid is deemed a Qualified Bid, PG&E will schedule time to discuss the Agreement. PG&E has a strong preference for standardized agreements. Agreements will not be final until execution.

**Question 3:** Is there a way to weight preferences for specific units or preferences for allocation (e.g. preference for full allocation of one unit versus a pro-rata allocation of multiple units) when submitting bids?

**Answer:** If a counterparty submitted Qualified Bids for multiple projects, PG&E will work with the counterparty on its Project preference—depending on Project availability and PG&E's evaluation of bids.

**Question 4:** Does the delivery quantity percentage have to be fixed for the full contract duration? Can the counterparty have a reduced percent allocation from the selected unit over the contract term instead?

**Answer:** For this solicitation, the percent allocation is fixed for the term of the agreement. The percent allocation is based on the actual generation of the resource which may vary.
