Background: Pacific Gas and Electric Company (www.pge.com), a subsidiary of PG&E Corporation, is one of the largest combined natural gas and electric energy companies in the United States. Based in San Francisco with more than 23,000 employees, PG&E is the primary natural gas and electric service provider for Northern and Central California spanning 70,000-square-mile service area stretches from Eureka to Bakersfield and from the Pacific Ocean to the Sierra Nevada. PG&E delivers some of the nation's cleanest energy to 16 million people.

RFQ Contract Opportunity Description: California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) Decision D.20-12-027 (December 17, 2020), issued updated requirements for California Investor-Owned Utilities (IOUs) to use revenue from their Low Carbon Fuel Standard (LCFS) credits to support transportation electrification. In accordance with the decision, PG&E filed AL 6226-E (available at https://www.pge.com/tariffs/assets/pdf/adviceletter/ELEC_6226-E.pdf) with the 2021 LCFS Implementation Plan. These programs were approved by the CPUC in December 2021.

One of PG&E's LCFS programs is the Residential Charging Solutions Pilot, which will support the use of residential Level 2 chargers at single-family and multi-family housing units without requiring the need for service panel upgrades through technology solutions. The pilot will offer a customer rebate for purchasing the technology solution and will provide an additional incentive for those customers located in equity communities. PG&E's Residential Charging Solutions Pilot term is approximately 3 years with a total inclusive budget of \$7.26 million for all incentives; administration; marketing, education, and outreach; and measure and evaluation.

The purpose of this RFQ is to solicit the market for technology solution(s) (Products) that enable Level 2 charging at home without the need of service panel upgrades. The selected product(s) will be incorporated into PG&E's Energy Action Guide (www.guide.pge.com) for purchase and include an eligible rebate for customers, at the direction of PG&E's program manager. PG&E will issue an RFQ through Wood Mackenzie Supply Chain for suppliers to provide specific product offering specifications and pricing for PG&E Review.

The successful suppliers must offer technology solutions that are readily available for customer purchase, cost-effective price point, satisfy safety certifications, and provide a positive customer experience. The contents of this COA and related RFQ are subject to change based on any updates or directive by the CPUC.
