GRANTEE HIGHLIGHTS

General Relief

\$1M over two years to [Relief for Energy Assistance through Community Help \(REACH\)](#) to assist customers with one-time bill payment assistance.

\$25K to the [Asian Pacific Fund](#) and their COVID-19 Recovery Fund, which supports East Bay and South Bay organizations addressing food and housing security, providing emergency cash assistance, combating racism and offering other support services within Asian American and Pacific Islander communities.

\$25K to the [Latino Community Foundation](#) and their Love Not Fear Fund, which provides immediate financial relief to Latino-led organizations as well as educational materials on vaccine awareness and availability.

Education Equity & Youth Development

\$500K to the [Californians Dedicated to Education Foundation](#) to support the new California Department of Education (CDE) Digital Divide Innovation Challenge intended to identify and implement a solution to expand high-speed internet access to all Californians. Funding will also support the CDE's Digital Literacy Family Engagement program and Digital Literacy Professional Development program that will serve vulnerable communities, delivering critical digital literacy skills to educators, students and families.

\$500K to the [Oakland Public Education Fund](#) to support phase two of #OaklandUndivided to ensure every Oakland public school student has access to a computer, internet connection and technology support.

\$100K to [nonprofits supporting youth](#) with learning recovery, social emotional support, as well as programs to prepare them for success in their post-secondary education and career pathways.

\$25K to the [Boys & Girls Club of Kern County](#) to help organize a Summer Learning Recovery Camp that provided youth with activities, breakfast, lunch and a snack each day.

\$10K to the [Paradise School District](#) to support summer programs, credit recovery and partnerships with the Boys and Girls Club to make up for lost learning over the past three years.

Small Business Support



\$500K to [California Restaurant Foundation](#) and their Restaurants Care Resilience Fund to provide over 100 grants to single-unit restaurants across the Bay Area, Central California and Sacramento, as well as additional support services, with priority given to restaurants owned by women and people of color.

Food Insecurity

\$200K to [California Association of Food Banks'](#) California Food Bank Rapid Response Fund to provide critical funding for 31 food banks across PG&E's service territory to increase their capacity to purchase food and supplies and supplement increased staffing needs.

\$100K to [organizations supporting seniors and vulnerable communities](#) with healthy meals and resources in over 15 counties across all five PG&E regions.

PG&E Coworkers Support PG&E Communities

Due to ongoing COVID-19 restrictions limiting in-person volunteerism, PG&E coworkers continue a successful program of home-based volunteering. PG&E has partially resumed in-person volunteering as restrictions have allowed, including two school beautification projects in Chico and Paradise.

To date, **more than 500 PG&E volunteers have supported 15 events** throughout our service territory. **PG&E volunteers have:**

- Prepared **more than 650 backpacks** for elementary school students in Bakersfield and Madera
- Helped assemble and pack **over 500 backpacks** to contribute to more than 8,000 distributed to students in Oakland
- Created over **100 wind chimes and wellness kits** for senior citizens in Bakersfield, Modesto and Sacramento
- Built over **80 bee and bird houses** for families impacted by wildfires in the Fresno area
- Organized **450 United Service Organizations care packages** to members training at the Coast Guard Training Center in Petaluma for Military Appreciation Month
