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PG&E wants public input on proposed Stockton-area power line project

Pacific Gas and Electric Company says it will hold several information sessions for the public to explain its plans for a new power line in the Stockton area.

Dubbed the “Northern San Joaquin Power Connect,” the project would provide increased reliability and efficiency for customers in Stockton, Lodi, Lockeford, Victor, Acampo and Thornton, the company says.

It includes the construction of new 230 kiloVolt high-capacity transmission lines to connect PG&E’s existing Lockeford and 8 Mile substations with Lodi Electric Utility’s existing Industrial Substation, as well as upgrades for these substations.

“The proposed Northern San Joaquin Power Connect project is a key component of our efforts to meet the needs of residents and the growing economy,” says Nick Glero, senior manager for PG&E’s Stockton Division. “This investment will help promote a strong commercial environment that attracts and retains a diverse group of employers and industries, and supports the thriving local wine industry.”
