## What is PG&E Doing to Prevent Wildfires?

Our wildfire safety work includes short-, medium- and long-term plans to reduce wildfire risk and keep our customers and communities safe.



**Continuing to build a safer and more resilient system** by hardening lines and installing sectionalizing devices to help reduce the size of outages



**Meeting and exceeding state vegetation standards** to manage trees and brush that could cause a wildfire or power outage



**Turning off power to prevent wildfires** for public safety and providing more resources before, during and after a Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS)



**Testing and using new tools and technologies** to reduce wildfire risk for the safety of our customers


