



Disability Disaster Access and Resources Program

Support and services to help you stay safe during wildfire safety power outages

PG&E partners with the California Foundation for Independent Living Centers (CFILC) to offer support for older adults and people with disabilities. This support is available before, during and after Public Safety Power Shutoffs (PSPS) and other wildfire safety power outages.

The Disability Disaster Access and Resources (DDAR) Program assists those who have medical and independent living needs with:

- Creating an emergency plan
- Signing up for the Medical Baseline Program
- Applying for a portable backup battery
- Obtaining ADA-accessible car rides and hotel stays during a PSPS
- Receiving food replacement during a PSPS



DDAR Program Eligibility

To qualify, a person must live in a High Fire-Threat District* or have experienced two or more PSPS since 2020 and either:

- Use an electrical medical device or assistive technology
- Have a disability or chronic condition
- Rely on electricity to live independently

The CFILC's Disability Disaster Advisory Committee will decide who qualifies for backup batteries and other resources. Medical needs and income will be taken into consideration. A doctor is not needed to verify disability or condition. Customers are encouraged to reach out to their local DDAR Center in advance of a safety outage.
