



IMPORTANT INSPECTION NOTICE

Every year, PG&E inspects and manages vegetation to keep trees away from the lines and reduce the risk of wildfire. PG&E also conducts post-work inspections to verify tree work was completed in accordance with clearance requirements and standards.

This important work is to help ensure the safety of you and your neighborhood.

Our inspection found:

- Tree work is needed. Tree crews will conduct the work in the coming weeks. Multiple visits may occur to complete the work. Please see back side to learn how wood debris will be addressed.
- We need to coordinate with you prior to tree work. **Please call** the contact below regarding:

 - Dog on property

- Tree(s) marked with "X" are scheduled for removal. Stumps will be treated with an EPA-approved herbicide, where appropriate, to control re-sprouting.

For Your Safety:

 **Do not attempt to prune trees near power lines.** Only line-qualified tree workers can work within 10 feet of these high voltage power lines. However, **it is the homeowner's responsibility to prune trees near the service wire.**

 When performing work near a service wire, please call our **Customer Care line** at **1-800-743-5000** to schedule a free service disconnect so that pruning can be done safely by you or your tree contractor.

Addressing wood debris

Wood or wood debris generated from vegetation management work legally belongs to the property owner.

As a service to our customers, PG&E will chip wood debris less than four inches in diameter, when accessible, which will be spread on site to CAL FIRE standards or hauled away.
