



Keeping Trees Away From Powerlines

Enhanced Vegetation Management

To further reduce the risk of wildfires and keep you and your community safe, PG&E has expanded and enhanced its vegetation safety work in high fire-threat areas. The goal of this important wildfire safety effort is to keep trees, limbs and branches away from powerlines and electric equipment.

As part of our enhanced safety work, we:

- **Prune limbs and branches** that overhang the 4-foot clearance zone around powerlines with a recommended 12-foot clearance minimum at time of prune for year-round compliance
- **Cut down dead, diseased, defective or dying trees** that pose a risk to powerlines or electric equipment
- **Evaluate the health and condition of trees** tall enough to strike powerlines or electric equipment

With the wildfire threat continuing to grow in California, many more trees around powerlines are now at risk of falling and damaging electric equipment. That is why we are performing this enhanced vegetation work to exceed state fire safety standards, in addition to our annual safety work to keep our customers safe.

What Customers Can Expect



PG&E will **inspect trees** to identify any safety risks.



If any safety work is planned for your property, you can expect to be **notified by phone calls, postcards and door hangers**.



After work is finished, crews will **conduct follow-up quality inspections** to ensure work meets required safety standards.



Customers may also see **crews conducting annual routine safety work** in their area.
