<u>Purpose</u>

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby submits this Advice Letter in compliance with Decision (D.) 17-03-021.

Background

On February 29, 2016, PG&E filed Application (A.) 16-02-019, "Application of Pacific Gas and Electric Company for Compliance Review of Utility Owned Generation Operations, Electric Energy Resource Recovery Account Entries, Contract Administration, Economic Dispatch of Electric Resources, Utility Owned Generation Fuel Procurement, Diablo Canyon Seismic Studies Balancing Account, and Other Activities for the Period January 1 through December 31, 2015."

On November 16, 2016, PG&E and the Office of Ratepayer Advocates filed a Joint Motion for Approval of Proposed Settlement (Joint Settlement), which resolved all of the outstanding issues in the proceeding, including a negotiated disallowance amount for a PG&E fossil facility and an uncontested disallowance for Contract Administration. D.17-03-021 approves the Joint Settlement and requires PG&E to file a Tier 1 Advice Letter in order to implement the authority granted in the settlement.¹ Ordering Paragraph 4 of D.17-03-021 states:

"4. Pacific Gas and Electric Company shall file a Tier 1 Advice Letter within 30 days of the issuance of this decision. The tariff sheets filed in this Advice Letter shall be effective on or after the date filed subject to the Commission's Energy Division determining they are in compliance with this decision."

This advice letter is filed in compliance with this requirement. There are no tariff sheets filed with this advice letter because no changes to PG&E's tariffs are required due to D.17-03-021.
