Subject: Supplemental Notice of Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Order on PG&E's Uncontested Settlement (TO19)

Purpose

In compliance with California Public Utilities Commission (Commission or CPUC) Resolution E-3930,¹ Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) submits this advice letter to provide the Commission with notice of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's (FERC) December 20, 2018 order approving the uncontested Offer of Settlement and Stipulation (Settlement) in PG&E's TO19 transmission rate case.

Pursuant to the Settlement, and as discussed in PG&E's Advice Letter 5444-E filed on December 18, 2018, PG&E will provide refunds to retail customers of the difference between amounts collected using the as-filed TO19 rates between March 1, 2018 and December 31, 2018 and the difference between the interim rates agreed to in the Settlement and the final Settlement rates (once the TO18 Final Decision is available) for the period between January 1, 2019 and April 30, 2019.

Background

On August 23, 2017, PG&E filed Advice Letter 5132-E to notify the Commission of PG&E's July 29, 2017 filing of TO19. On October 18, 2017, PG&E filed Advice Letter 5132-E-A to notify the Commission of FERC's September 28, 2017 order accepting PG&E's TO19 filing, suspending the rate change for five months to become effective on March 1, 2018, subject to refund, and establishing hearing and settlement judge procedures.

¹ Process Element 4 of Resolution E-3930 states that "utilities shall update their advice letters with a supplement whenever the requested rate changes are approved, modified, or denied at the FERC, as appropriate."

On October 19, 2018 in compliance with Process Element 3 of Resolution E-3930, PG&E filed Advice Letter 5407-E to notify the Commission of PG&E's filing of the TO19 Settlement. Then, on December 18, 2018, PG&E filed Advice Letter 5444-E to inform the Commission that, on October 9, 2018, FERC's Chief ALJ had granted the Motion for Interim Rates that was filed as part of the Settlement and had authorized the implementation of such interim rates effective July 1, 2018 for wholesale customers and January 1, 2019 for retail customers, pending FERC's final action on the Settlement. On December 20, 2018, FERC approved the TO19 Settlement.

The TO19 Settlement provides, among other things, that the final TO19 revenue requirements shall be 98.85% of the FERC-authorized TO18 revenue requirement. Specifically, FERC's letter order approving the TO19 Settlement provides:

PG&E is directed to make a compliance filing with revised tariff records in eTariff format, to be effective March 1, 2018, within 30 days of the final, non-appealable decision in Docket No. ER16-2320-000, et al., reflecting the final TO19 rates based on the formula provided in the Settlement.

Since FERC has yet to issue a final, non-appealable decision in TO18, PG&E will continue to implement the currently effective interim rates until the TO20 rates become effective on May 1, 2019. The difference in the amounts actually collected using the as-filed rates and interim rates and the amounts that would have been collected using the to-be-determined final TO19 Settlement rates for the period between March 1, 2018 and April 30, 2019 will be refunded through PG&E's established End-Use Customer Refund Balancing Account Adjustment mechanism.
