SUBJECT: Supplemental: Joint IOU Submission of VGI Working Group Facilitator Updates in Compliance with Ordering Paragraph (OP) 7 of R.18-12-006

San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E), Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), and Southern California Edison Company (SCE) (collectively, the “Joint IOUs”) hereby submit this supplemental advice letter (AL) for approval to the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) of the estimated incremental facilitator cost for the five month extension of the interagency Vehicle Grid Integration (VGI) Working Group (WG) from January 31, 2020 to June 30, 2020.

PURPOSE

Pursuant to the Assigned Commissioner’s Scoping Memo and Ruling (Ruling) in Rulemaking (R.) 18-12-006, the Joint IOUs are required to file a supplemental Tier 2 advice letter no later than December 1, 2019, seeking authority to recover the incremental costs of extending the contract for the VGI working group facilitator.

The Joint IOUs filed AL 3446-E on October 25, 2019 for approval by the Commission of the estimated cost of a six-month working group, the selected facilitator, and a plan to provide regular updates to the service list. This supplement AL provides the estimated incremental facilitator cost for the five month extension of the VGI WG from January 31, 2020 to June 30, 2020.

BACKGROUND

In continuation of the development of rates and infrastructure for vehicle electrification, on May 2, 2019, a Ruling in R.18-12-006 was issued directing the Joint IOUs to develop a solicitation to select a technical facilitator to lead the VGI WG in consultation with the Commission’s Energy Division. Pursuant to OP 7 of the Ruling, the technical facilitator was required to be hired no later than June 1, 2019 and would be tasked with organizing and facilitating the interagency VGI WG.

On May 22, 2019, the IOUs filed an extension of time to comply with OP 7 of the Ruling. On June 3, 2019, the Commission's Executive Director approved the IOUs' request for additional time to complete the facilitator selection deadline to August 1, 2019.

On July 1, 2019, SDG&E filed AL 3387-E requesting authority to establish the Working Group Facilitator Memorandum Account (WGFMA). AL 3387-E was approved and is effective as of July 31, 2019.

On October 18, 2019, the IOUs filed a request to extend the deadline for the VGI WG final report from January 31, 2020 to June 30, 2020. On October 24, the Commission approved the IOUs' request for an extension of time to complete the interagency VGI WG progress report and final report. The VGI WG progress report shall be due on January 24, 2020 and the final report shall be due on June 30, 2020. The IOUs are directed to file a Tier 2 Advice Letter with the Commission's Energy Division with the estimated cost of the extension by December 1, 2019.

Discussion

In order to select the VGI WG facilitator, the IOUs conducted an open Request for Proposal (RFP). The RFP was to select a facilitator for the VGI WG as described in the Ruling, including organizing meetings, taking and distributing meeting minutes, documenting stakeholder positions, and leading the authoring of the interim progress reports and the final WG report.

The contract for the facilitation of the six month working group was awarded to Gridworks Organization (Gridworks or the Facilitator). SDG&E and Gridworks signed a Standard Services Agreement (Agreement) dated and effective as of August 1, 2019, at a Not to Exceed amount of ██████████, an amount derived from the RFP described above. Gridworks has estimated incremental facilitation costs to cover the extension period at a Not to Exceed amount of ██████████. As of December 1, 2019, the Joint IOUs have not signed an extension contract with Gridworks. However, the Joint IOUs are in active contract extension discussions with Gridworks.

The contracted rates offered by Gridworks are consistent with market rates for similar work and Gridworks has committed to providing detailed descriptions of the work performed for each cost incurred. The costs will be shared by the IOUs, per the Ruling.

EFFECTIVE DATE

This joint submittal is subject to Energy Division disposition and is classified as Tier 2 (effective after staff approval) pursuant to GO 96-B. SDG&E respectfully requests that this submittal be approved effective January 1, 2020, which is 30 days from the date submitted.

PROTEST

Anyone may protest this Advice Letter to the Commission. The protest must state the grounds upon which it is based, including such items as financial and service impact, and should be submitted expeditiously. The protest must be made in writing and must be received no later than December 23, 2019, which is 21 days after the date this Advice Letter was submitted with the Commission. I, Brittany Applestein Syz, do declare as follows:


