Subject: Submits Notice of Construction, Pursuant to General Order 131-D, for the Construction Kasson-Louise 60 kV Power Line Relocation, County of San Joaquin County

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (“PG&E” or “the Company”) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

To accommodate development between Madruga Road and Chiavari Way in the City of Lathrop (larger project), South Lathrop Land LLC has requested Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) to relocate an approximately 0.75-mile segment of the Kasson-Louise 60 Kilovolt (kV) Power Line. PG&E will relocate and replace approximately 7 existing wood poles (approximately 58 to 72 feet above ground) with 3 Light Duty Steel Poles (approximately 43 to 76 feet above ground) and 4 Tubular Steel Poles (approximately 95 to 115 feet above ground). Height increases are required to comply with California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) General Order 95 minimum ground-to-conductor clearance requirements, while accommodating the electric distribution wires on the power line poles (underbuild).

The project begins at an existing wood power pole at the property between Madruga Road and Chiavari Way, located approximately 275 feet from Highway 120 in Lathrop, CA. The new alignment will travel southwest along Madruga Road for approximately 0.35 miles, then south along the route of the San Joaquin River levee for approximately 0.33 miles, and then approximately 0.10 miles northeast to the south connection point.

Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin May 2020 and completed by July 2020, or as soon as possible after construction begins.

Exemption from CPUC Permit Requirement: CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1, exempts a utility from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct if a project meets specific conditions. This project qualifies for the following exemption:

f. "power lines or substations to be relocated or constructed which have undergone environmental review pursuant to CEQA as part of a larger project, and for which the final CEQA document (Environmental Impact Report or Negative Declaration) finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts caused by the proposed line or substation."

The City of Lathrop adopted the Final EIR for the South Lathrop Specific Plan area and the South Lathrop Specific Plan Addendum dated 9-9-2018, that includes the South Lathrop Commerce Center, finding no significant unavoidable environmental impacts resulting from PG&E's required utility relocations (State Clearinghouse # 2013012064), CEQA EIR document.

This filing will not cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.
