Purpose

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby submits this Advice Letter in compliance with Decision (D.) 20-02-006.

Background

On February 28, 2019, PG&E filed Application (A.) 19-02-018, "Application of Pacific Gas and Electric Company for Compliance Review of Utility Owned Generation Operations, Electric Energy Resource Recovery Account Entries, Contract Administration, Economic Dispatch of Electric Resources, Utility Owned Generation Fuel Procurement, Diablo Seismic Studies Balancing Account, and Other Activities for the Period January 1 through December 31, 2018."

On September 30, 2019, PG&E, Public Advocates Office, and the Joint Community Choice Aggregators (Joint CCAs)¹ filed a Joint Motion for Approval of Proposed Settlement (Joint Settlement), which resolved all of the outstanding issues in the proceeding, including negotiated disallowance amounts for PG&E Utility-Owned Generation facilities. D.20-02-006 approves the Joint Settlement and requires PG&E to submit a Tier 1 Advice Letter in order to implement the authority granted in the settlement.² Ordering Paragraph (OP) 8 of D.19-02-005 states:

"8. No later than 30 days from the issuance of this decision, Pacific Gas and Electric Company shall file a Tier One Advice Letter to implement the authority granted herein. The tariff sheets filed in the Advice Letter shall be effective on or

after the date filed, subject to the Commission's Energy Division determining the tariff sheets comply with this decision."

This Advice Letter is submitted in compliance with this requirement. There are no tariff sheets submitted with this advice letter because no changes to PG&E's tariffs are required due to D.20-02-006.
