Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E" or "the Company") hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

To accommodate the Peninsula Corridor Electrification Project (larger project) in the City of San Jose, the Peninsula Corridor Joint Powers Board (JPB) has requested Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) to construct an intertie between PG&E's FMC Substation (767 Newhall Street, San Jose) and JPB's Traction Power Station #2 (TPS #2) with a new overhead 115 Kilovolt (kV) double-circuit power line (line). The line begins at the southwest side of FMC Substation and runs southeast approximately 450 feet crossing over Interstate Highway 880 (I-880), then progresses northeast along the south side of Interstate 880 and finally turns southeast along Chestnut Street to terminate at JPB's future TPS #2 (1025 Stockton Avenue, San Jose). The overhead line (including the portion within TPS #2) is approximately 1,100 feet in length and consists of approximately five new tubular steel poles (TSPs) ranging in height from approximately 86 to 116 feet tall. Taller poles are needed to accommodate crossing over the elevated segment of I-880. PG&E may need to install Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) obstruction lighting on some or all of the new TSPs in accordance with FAA requirements. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in the third

quarter of 2020, or as soon as practicable after project approval. Construction will be completed in the first quarter of 2021, or as soon as possible after construction begins.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. The Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s),

f. "power lines or substations to be relocated or constructed which have undergone environmental review pursuant to CEQA as part of a larger project, and for which the final CEQA document (Environmental Impact Report (EIR) or Negative Declaration) finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts caused by the proposed line or substation."

The Peninsula Corridor Joint Powers Board adopted an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) dated January 2015 for the Peninsula Corridor Electrification Project and an Addendum to the EIR in March 2020, finding no significant unavoidable environmental impacts resulting from the proposed intertie, (both documents use State Clearinghouse # 2013012079).

Additionally, PG&E will employ "no cost" and specified "low cost" measures to reduce public exposure to EMF in accordance with California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) Decision 06-01-042 and the "EMF Design Guidelines for Electrical Facilities" prepared in compliance with that decision. The following measures are proposed for this project:

- Optimize phase configuration by "cross-phasing" individual circuits to cancel magnetic fields.

This filing will not cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

- a. There is reasonable possibility that the activity may have an impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern where designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies; or
- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

- 1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
- 2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
- 3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
- 4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
