**Subject: Supplemental: Addition of Customer Gift Payment Option to Electric and Gas Rule 9 – *Rendering and Payment of Bills.***

**Purpose**

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) is requesting Commission's (California Public Utilities Commission or CPUC) approval for revisions to Electric and Gas Rule 9 - *Rendering and Payment of Bills*, to enable a gift payment as an additional payment option, where a third party can make a gift payment on an outstanding bill for a customer.

As recommended by the Energy Division, PG&E is submitting this supplemental advice letter to add clarifying language and to incorporate suggested refinements to Sample Form 79-1205. This supplemental advice letter replaces the original advice letter in its entirety.

**Background**

PG&E customers have a variety of payment option to pay their monthly energy bills, including the following:

- Cash
- Automatic Bank Debit
- Debit Card
- Check
- Money Order
- Credit Card

The use of a gift card, debit card, credit card and electronic bank debit may have an associated transaction fee over and above the PG&E bill amount that would be charged by the third-party for their services.

PG&E is now expanding the payment options to enable a third party (payor) to make a "Gift Payment" on a PG&E customer's energy bill. The payor would only need to provide the customer name and address and an acceptable means of payment. The payor can choose the amount and their payment would be applied to the recipient's account. Treatment of the payment and presentment on the bill will be like any other payment. For

customer privacy and security reasons, PG&E will not divulge any information regarding the intended recipient's account, including the account balance. The recipient will be notified that a gift payment was made on their behalf by the payor, as indicated by the payor in the Purchaser Information section of the gift payment form.

The target audience for a gift payment program could be one of the following:

- A charitable donation to someone in financial need due to COVID-19 or other hardships
- Holiday gifts
- A relative living on a fixed income
- Children living away from home or in college
- A local business financially affected by COVID-19

In order to process this transaction, PG&E has also created Form 79-1205 – *PG&E Gift Payment Form*, which includes instructions on how to submit the form both by mail-in or in-person to one of our local offices<sup>1</sup>.

There are several utilities throughout the country that currently offer a similar payment option program including Pacific Power whose service territory includes parts of Northern California.

PG&E takes pride in being part of our community and the addition of this gift payment program will give PG&E an additional resource for customers who may be in need of assistance. Program information will be made accessible on the PG&E web page alongside all current other payment methods.

### **Tariff Revisions**

PG&E is seeking approval for the following revisions to our electric and gas tariffs:

- Add new Section E.4 in both Gas and Electric Rule 9 that state: “A third party (payor) may elect to make a gift payment on a PG&E customer’s energy bill by using the PG&E Gift Payment Form (Form 79-1205).” Treatment of such payment and presentment on the bill will be like any other payment.
- Addition of PG&E Sample Form 79-1205 - *PG&E Gift Payment Form*

The affected tariff sheets are listed on the enclosed Attachment 1. This submittal would not increase any current rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with

any rate schedule or rule. For convenience of the reader, PG&E has included redline revisions to Electric and Gas Rule 9 in Attachment 2.

**Protests**

Pursuant to GO 96-B, General Rule 7.5.1, PG&E requests to maintain the original protest and comment period designated in Advice 4252-G/5835-E and not reopen the protest period. The revisions made in this supplemental advice letter are minor and are being made at the request of the Energy Division.

**Effective Date**

Pursuant to General Order (GO) 96-B, Rule 5.2, this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 2 designation. PG&E requests that this Tier 2 advice submittal become effective on regular notice, June 28, 2020, which is 30 calendar days after the date of submittal.
