<u>Purpose</u>

Pursuant to Decision (D.) 20-05-019 (Decision), Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) hereby submits this Advice Letter to provide updated recorded amounts for the foregoing accounts detailed in the Settlement Agreement.

Background

As part of the Settlement Agreement, modified and approved by the Decision, PG&E agreed to not seek recovery of certain wildfire-related expenditures, totaling \$1,625,000,000. Per the Decision, PG&E will not seek to recover an additional \$198,000,000 within four years of the Effective Date. This advice letter provides updated recorded amounts for the accounts totaling \$1,625,000,000 identified in the settlement agreement.

(Note 1): Other than where noted, recorded amounts in excess of those estimated at the time of settlement will not be written off pursuant to this Decision.

(Note 2): Due to under-spending in the 2017 Northern California Wildfires CEMA expense of approximately \$4.2 million, PG&E had made up the shortfall in the Transmission Safety Repairs expense category. Pending final recorded amounts in other accounts, the final Transmission Safety Repairs write-off amount may increase further to accommodate any shortfalls

(Note 3): PG&E will file another Tier 2 Advice Letter when those projects are completed and the associated capital expenditures have been recorded, and propose a final allocation of the amounts for which PG&E shall not seek rate recovery in accordance with the Decision.

This submittal would not increase any current rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.

² WMPMA is the Wildfire Mitigation Plan Memorandum Account.
