Purpose

Pursuant to Ordering Paragraph (OP) 13 of Decision (D.)18-09-044, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) submits this Tier 1 information-only advice letter adjusting PG&E, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E) and Southern California Edison Company's (SCE) proportionate shares of the \$2 million budget set aside for measurement and evaluation (M&E) of the net energy metering (NEM) successor tariff. PG&E has permission to file this advice letter on behalf of SDG&E and SCE.

Background

On September 27, 2018, the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC or Commission) approved D.18-09-044, *Adopting Net Energy Metering Consumer Protection Measures Including Solar Information Packet*. In OP 13, the Commission authorized

...up to \$2 million co-funded proportionally according to 2018 retail electric revenue, from Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Southern California Edison Company, and San Diego Gas & Electric Company (together, the electric utilities), to be set aside for measurement and evaluation of the net energy metering successor tariff. Within 30 days of the issue date of this decision, each of the electric utilities shall submit a Tier 2 advice letter establishing a balancing account to collect its proportionate share of the \$2 million budget,

and will collect those costs through their respective public purpose program surcharges.

Although OP 13 of D.18-09-044 directs the Investor Owned Utilities (IOUs) to collect the \$2 million budget proportionally according to 2018 retail electric revenue, in establishing their respective balancing accounts to record and recover NEM study costs,¹ the three IOUs used the 2017 Total Revenues Net of Provision For Refunds, represented by Line 14 on Page 300 of the 2017 FERC Form 1 since the 2018 data was not available until May 2019.

Given the timing of the pending NEM successor tariff lookback study, which wasn't initiated until late 2019, SDG&E began paying study invoices in 2020 and the IOUs are just establishing their cofunding measures. It was recognized that the IOUs could now use the allocation methodology originally outlined in OP 13.

By this advice letter, PG&E complies with OP 13 by updating the revenue collection based on the 2018 FERC filings of the three IOUs. Based on the 2018 total revenues Net of Provision for Refunds, represented by Line 14 on page 300 of each Utility's 2018 FERC Form 1, the respective shares of the \$2,000,000 funding are as follows:
