Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E" or "the Company") hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

To maintain safe and reliable electric service in San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara counties, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) is proposing to replace wires (reconductoring), re-tension wires, replace hardware, install tower extensions, install new shield wire with tower peaks, install 1 new tubular steel pole (TSP), and install 3 new grounding rods on approximately 4.0 miles of the existing Mesa-Santa Maria double circuit 115 Kilovolt (kV) Power Line in agricultural, residential and undeveloped areas of unincorporated San Luis Obispo County, and in residential and commercial areas in the City of Santa Maria (Santa Barbara County), all within existing utility easement or franchise. The project is needed to comply with CPUC General Order 95 minimum ground-to-conductor clearance requirements and eliminate wire overtensioning.

The project begins at an existing PG&E tower in unincorporated San Luis Obispo County approximately 0.3 mile northwest of the intersection of Hutton Road with Vista del Rio Road and runs south approximately 1.3 miles crossing over Highway 101,

traversing farmland, residential, and crossing over the Santa Maria River into the City of Santa Maria (Santa Barbara County). The project continues due south approximately 2.7 miles parallel with Railroad Avenue through the City of Santa Maria, ending at PG&E's Santa Maria Substation located at the intersection of South Railroad Avenue with West Cypress Street. PG&E will modify approximately 9 existing towers with 10-foot to 15-foot tall extensions. PG&E will install 2-foot to 5-foot tall peaks on approximately 30 existing towers to support new shield wire. PG&E will also install (inter-set) 1 new TSP approximately 95 feet tall within the existing power line alignment. Helicopters will be used to facilitate construction at approximately 5 tower locations with constrained access in undeveloped and agricultural areas of San Luis Obispo County. The existing line spans over the Santa Maria River, however helicopters will be used to avoid impacting the bed, bank and channel, by eliminating the need for ground access. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in September 2020, or as soon as practicable after project approval, with completion in December 2020, or as soon as possible after construction begins.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. The Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s).

g. "power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR [Environmental Impact Report] finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts."

This filing will not cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.
