**Subject: Revised Rule 20A Reallocation Final Calculation**

**Purpose**

The purpose of this Advice is to submit a revised Rule 20A reallocation calculation.

**Background**

On December 5, 2019 Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) received the Energy Division's letter dated November 18, 2019 providing notice of the rejection, without prejudice, of Advice Letter 5604-E relating to the Final List of Inactive Rule 20A Communities and Reallocation Details. PG&E was ordered to, "notify all the communities considered inactive in the Rule 20A program that they have an additional 90 calendar days to become an active undergrounding community and not be subject to reallocation." PG&E was further directed to, "refile this Tier 1 Advice Letter with the final list of inactive Rule 20A communities promptly within 5 business days of the conclusion of the 90 [day] period."

At the conclusion of this 90-day period, PG&E filed Advice Letter 5783-E. In this Advice Letter, PG&E requested that communities be provided an additional 90-days to become active due to the discovery that not all inactive communities were noticed properly. It was also discovered that certain actions taken by city/counties caused active communities to become inactive during the 90-day period. The CPUC made Advice Letter 5783-E effective as of April 17, 2020.

PG&E re-noticed all inactive communities and additionally sent confirmation notices to communities considered active. The Rule 20A Program followed up with email and phone calls to inactive communities during the 90-day period to ensure all communities were sufficiently informed and given the opportunity to become active if they chose to do so. PG&E submits the attached final list of communities and reallocation amounts for the Live Oak Blvd Project in the City of Live Oak and will make these adjustments accordingly in the Rule 20A Work Credit Ledger.

This submittal would not increase any current rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.
