Purpose

In accordance with Ordering Paragraph (OP) 10 of Decision (D.) 20-08-046, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) is establishing Electric Preliminary Statement Part II - Climate Adaptation Vulnerability Assessment Memorandum Account (CAVAMA) and Gas Preliminary Statement Part FI – Climate Adaptation Vulnerability Assessment Memorandum Account effective September 9/11/2020, to record and recover costs directly related to the climate vulnerability assessments and any incremental costs related to the community engagement, the Community Engagement Plans, and the related community engagement surveys ordered in Decision (D.) 20-08-046 .

Background

The Commission opened the climate adaptation rulemaking, R. 18-04-019, on April 26, 2018. Within the initial rulemaking the commission detailed five different topics in the proceeding: (1) Definition of Climate Adaptation, (2) Data Sources, (3) Guidelines for Utility Planning, (4) Disadvantaged Vulnerable Communities (DVCs), and (5) Climate Vulnerability Assessments (CVAs). A working group report was issued on January 25, 2019 titled “Definition of Adaptation for Utilities” which detailed the appropriate definition of adaptation and data sources, Topics 1 and 2 respectively. The Commission approved a final decision, (D.) 19-10-054, on October 24th, 2019 on the definition of climate adaptation and data sources (Topic 1 and Topic 2).

The Commission issued a staff report pertaining to topic 4, disadvantaged vulnerable communities, on June 25, 2019. An additional staff report pertaining to topic 5, climate vulnerability assessments, was issued separately on October 22nd, 2019.

The CPUC approved a final decision, (D.) 20-08-046, on August 27th, 2020 detailing the scope of vulnerability assessments, definition of disadvantaged vulnerable communities, and community engagement requirements. The decision addresses topics 3, 4, 5 and completes Phase 1 of the climate adaptation proceeding.

OP 10 of D. 20-08-046 requires the IOUs to submit a Tier 1 Advice Letter with the Commission's Energy Division to establish a memorandum account, titled "Climate Adaptation Vulnerability Assessment Memorandum Account – CAVAMA" for the purpose of tracking costs directly related to the vulnerability assessments and any incremental costs related to the community engagement, the Community Engagement Plans, and the related community engagement surveys ordered in this decision. The effective date of the memorandum account shall be the date the Tier 1 Advice Letter is submitted.
