Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E" or "the Company") hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

To accommodate the widening of State Route 162 (Highway 162) in the City of Oroville, Butte County, the State of California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has requested Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) to relocate approximately 1.25 miles of the existing Palermo-Oroville No. 2 60 kilovolt (kV) Power Line. replace and relocate approximately 20 existing wood poles with approximately 20 new wood poles; and install one new wood pole on the existing power line. begins at an existing wood pole located approximately 100 feet east of the intersection of Highway 162 with Foothill Boulevard and runs east along Highway 162 to an existing wood pole located approximately 1,500 feet west of the intersection of Highway 162 with Tyme Way. The new wood poles will be approximately 0 to 26 feet taller than the existing wood poles to comply with California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) General Order 95 minimum ground-to-conductor requirements, while accommodating Caltrans proposed improvements, and electric distribution wires (underbuild) on the power line poles. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in the first quarter of 2021, or as soon as practicable after project approval. Construction is scheduled to be completed in May 2021, or as soon as possible after construction begins.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. The Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s),

f. "power lines or substations to be relocated or constructed which have undergone environmental review pursuant to CEQA as part of a larger project, and for which the final CEQA document (Environmental Impact Report (EIR) or Negative Declaration) finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts caused by the proposed line or substation."

Caltrans adopted an Initial Study with Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Butte 162 Road Widening Project, finding no significant unavoidable environmental impacts resulting from PG&E's required utility relocations (February 9, 2020; State Clearinghouse No. 2018122050). https://ceqanet.opr.ca.gov/2018122050/2

This submittal will not cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.
