Subject: Pacific Gas & Electric Company's (PG&E) Self-Generation Incentive Program (SGIP) Tier 1 Advice Letter (AL) Confirming Fund Transfer pursuant to Decision (D.)20-10-017

Purpose

Pursuant to Opening Paragraph (OP) 3(a) of D.20-10-017, PG&E respectfully submits this Tier 1 AL to confirm transfer of funds required in D.20-10-017, as outlined below. The sum of \$42,700,000 has been transferred *out* of PG&E's General Market Large Commercial energy storage budget *to* the Non-Residential Equity Budget and the Residential Equity Budget accordingly:

SGIP PA	Non-Residential Equity Funds	Residential Equity Funds
PG&E	\$36,000,000	\$6,700,000

Background

On June 9, 2020 the California Energy Storage Alliance (CESA) filed a Motion to Issue a Ruling that would transfer funds to the equity budget. This motion was subsequently denied on procedural grounds.

On June 10, 2020 CESA filed a Petition to Modify D.20-01-021 and D.16-06-055 asking for a ruling to, in part, remove a moratorium on SGIP Program Administrators (PAs) fund transfer authority, and to authorize SGIP PAs to immediately transfer funds between technology incentive budgets.

On August 6, 2020 an Assigned Commissioner Ruling (ACR) was issued asking for comment on a number of topics. Topics relevant to this advice letter are:

- SGIP PA fund transfer authority as adopted in D.20-01-021 remains unchanged;
- \$100 million in funds are to be transferred from the statewide SGIP PAs Large-Scale General Market Budget to the Non-Residential Equity Budget;

- No funds are transferred out of the Equity Resiliency Budget.

Parties filed comments on August 21, 2020.

On October 22, 2020 the Commission voted to adopt the proposed decision.

Discussion

Pursuant to D.20-10-017, as of November 10, 2020, PG&E has transferred a total of \$42.7M from its General Market Large Commercial energy storage budget accordingly:

- \$36M to the Non-Residential Equity Budget Step 5, with the effective date of November 11, 2020, and
- \$6.7M to the Residential Equity Budget Step 5, with the effective date of November 10, 2020
- Total Transferred: $\$36\text{M} + \$6.7\text{M} = \$42.7\text{M}$

PG&E first utilized all of the available funds from its General Market Large Commercial energy storage Step 5 budget to fulfill this transfer. That budget did not contain sufficient funds to fulfill the order of D.20-10-017 so PG&E then utilized available General Market Large Commercial Step 4 funds to fulfill the remaining fund transfer, as follows:

PG&E General Market Large Commercial Step 5 Available Funds = \$20,596,172.38.

PG&E reallocated \$6,700,000 from this budget to the Residential Equity Budget Step 5.

Remaining PG&E General Market Large Commercial Step 5 funds: $\$20,596,172.38 - \$6,700,000 = \$13,896,172.38$.

PG&E then transferred all \$13,896,172.38 from the General Market Large Commercial energy storage Step 5 budget to the Non-Residential Equity Budget Step 5.

Remaining funds required for transfer from PG&E's General Market Large Commercial Step 4 to the Non-Residential Equity Budget (after all funds in the Large Commercial Step 5 have been utilized): $\$36,000,000 - \$13,896,172.38 = \$22,103,827.62$.

PG&E Step 4 Available Funds = \$44,368,192.

$\$44,368,192.88 - \$22,103,827.62 = \$22,264,365.26$ remaining in Step 4 *after* transfer.

In summary, \$36,000,000 has been allocated to PG&E's Non-Residential Equity Budget and \$6,700,000 has been allocated to PG&E's Residential Equity Budget.

Funds allocated to the Residential Equity Budget have been immediately applied to the waitlist. However, Ordering Paragraph (OP) 3(b) requires that SGIP PAs "run a one-time-

only random lottery, with no prioritization criteria, on all Non-Residential Equity Budget applications received on May 12, 2020 that have been accepted but are not yet under review and use these lotteries to reserve the \$100 million fund transfer adopted in this decision.” Further, OP3(c) requires the PAs to use the lottery “to determine the waitlist for the remaining Non-Residential Equity Budget applications, if any....”

While PG&E has reallocated funds in accordance with this Decision, and the funds are no longer available to new General Market Large Commercial customers, the lottery has not yet been developed and executed. Once Energy Solutions completes its development the lottery will be automatically performed and Non-Residential Equity Budget projects will be allocated funding per the results of the lottery. This process may take up to 30 days. Further, a new waitlist will be developed from the projects that did not win in the lottery, per OP3(c).

Conclusion:

PG&E respectfully submits this Tier 1 AL as ordered in D.20-10-017 and has transferred funding from its General Market Large Commercial energy storage budgets Step 5 and Step 4 to the Residential and Non-Residential Equity budgets as described above.
