Purpose

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) submits this advice letter to close the Electric Preliminary Statement Part GC, California Energy Systems for the 21st Century Balancing Account (CES-21).

Background

The CES-21 program was a collaboration between Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Southern California Gas, San Diego Gas & Electric Company (Joint IOUs) and the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL). This research and development (R&D) leveraged the supercomputing power and expertise of the laboratory to deliver innovative solutions to Cybersecurity and Grid Integration in the 21st Century.

On July 18, 2011, the Joint IOUs filed Application (A.) 11-07-008. In this application the Joint IOUs requested authority to recover funding costs up to a maximum of \$152.19 million in program funding over five years, with the funding shared among the Joint Utilities as follows: PG&E (55%), SCE (35%), and SDG&E (10%).

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC or Commission) issued Decision (D.) 12-12-031 on December 20, 2012, which granted authority for the Joint IOUs to enter into a research and development agreement with LLNL. This decision authorized the Joint IOUs to spend a total of \$152.19 million over five years, with costs allocated as follows to each of the utilities: PG&E (55%), SCE (35%), and SDG&E (10%), and adopted a ratemaking mechanism for each utility to permit recovery of those costs.

On September 26, 2013, Governor Brown signed Senate Bill (SB) 96, which among other things, limited the scope of the CES-21 Program and narrowed its focus to cybersecurity and grid integration R&D projects.

On March 27, 2014, the Commission issued D.14-03-029, which modified D.12-12-031 to comply with SB 96. In D.14-03-029, the Commission reduced the CES-21 budget from \$152.19 million to \$35 million over a five-year period and modified the cost allocation to PG&E (50%), SCE (41%), and SDG&E (9%). Ordering Paragraph 7 of this Decision authorized PG&E to recover these costs through the Distribution Revenue Adjustment Mechanism and to open a balancing account to record the difference between its share of the program expenses and its annual revenue requirement.

Over the period of 2014 to 2019, the Joint IOUs and LLNL supported several cybersecurity capability development efforts, including the development of a modeling platform to simulate threat scenarios, a physical testbed to evaluate threats of substation assets, and an automated research package for Machine-to-Machine Automated Threat Response. They also developed new Grid Integration and flexibility metrics that modeled thousands of permutations of market command, weather conditions and investment in infrastructure. In 2017, the Grid Integration project was successfully completed. The Cybersecurity project successfully completed in 2019. The Joint IOUs filed a final report on December 26, 2019, and a revised report with final financials on August 27, 2020.

PG&E's Electric Preliminary Statement GC for California Energy Systems for the 21st Century Balancing Account – Electric (CES21BA-E) carries an over-collected balance of \$760,137.92. Upon approval of this advice letter, PG&E will dispose of the balance, plus interest, in its next electric rate change, and retire Electric Preliminary Statement Part GC upon transfer.

This submittal would not increase any current rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.
