**Subject:** Report in Compliance with Ordering Paragraph 1 of Decision 21-10-020

**Purpose**

This filing provides information required by Ordering Paragraph 1 (OP 1) of Decision (D.) 21-10-020 regarding PG&E's restoration, rebuilding, and reconstruction activities related to January 2021 Atmospheric River Event.

**Background**

OP 1 of D.21-10-020 requires that:

In the event of a disaster, declared either by the Governor of California or the President of the United States, that also damages their facilities or leads to a service outage, Investor-Owned Utilities (IOUs) shall file a Tier 1 Advice Letter within 15 business days from when they are allowed into a disaster area to assess the damage to their facilities. IOUs shall file this Advice Letter with the Commission's Energy Division, with a copy sent to the Communications Division at TD.\_PAL@cpuc.ca.gov. The Advice Letter also must be provided to the appropriate local government contained within the disaster area, including the chief executive or leader of the city, township or Tribal government. In the case of an unincorporated area, the communication must be established with the appropriate County. In the case of Tribal governments, the Advice Letter must be provided to any Tribe(s) that have Tribal lands or ancestral territory overlapping with any portion of the disaster area. The Advice Letter shall include the following details:

- a. a report of what facilities or equipment was damaged;
- b. restoration and/or rebuild plans, including a description of what is being repaired, replaced or added, and maps of where the restoration will occur;
- c. the date the investor-owned utility received access to the damaged area;
- d. the timeline to make repairs;
- e. any changes to any energy/communication infrastructure required; and

f. the contact information of the individual responsible for community engagement in these instances.

On November 17, 2021, Governor Newsom proclaimed a State of Emergency in the counties of Mendocino, Napa, San Benito, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Sonoma, Tehama, and Trinity due to the atmospheric river event that occurred back in January 2021. Governor Newsome had previously declared a State of Emergency in the counties of Monterey and San Luis Obispo on January 29, 2021. PG&E began the restoration activities in the counties included in the Governor's November 17 declaration on January 26, 2021 and completed the restoration activities on February 15, 2021. The information required by OP 1 is as follows:

1) Facilities / equipment damaged: The table below lists the equipment which was damaged and replaced during the service restoration process:

2) Restoration / Rebuild Plans – PG&E began the service restoration as soon as it was safe to conduct the work and before the Governor's January 29 or November 17 Declarations. Service restoration was accomplished by replacing equipment on a like-for-like basis.

3) Date received access to damaged areas – PG&E was not under any restricted access at the request of government agency.

4) Timeline to make repairs – PG&E completed service restoration to 139,357 customers on February 15, 2021.

5) Changes to infrastructure – N/A Service restoration was accomplished by replacing equipment on a like-for-like basis.

6) Contact information of community engagement – N/A This was a service restoration activity accomplished by replacement of equipment on a like-for-like basis, not a rebuild effort.

PG&E is submitting this Advice Letter because the November 17, 2021 proclamation was issued after the Commission's decision requiring this submittal although the proclamation added the counties of Del Norte, Los Angeles, Madera, Mariposa, Mendocino, Napa, Orange, San Benito, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Siskiyou, Sonoma, Tehama, and Trinity counties to the counties included in the Governor's January 29, 2021 proclamation. As noted above PG&E completed the service restoration activities on February 15, 2021.

Since this was a service restoration effort requiring immediate action, PG&E did not engage with community stakeholders prior to the restoration work as contemplated by OP2 of D.21-10-020 prior to commencing the work. Accordingly, PG&E will not be submitting a second Advice letter as contemplated in OP3.

### **Tariff Revisions**

This submittal does not require any tariff revisions and would not increase any current rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.
