Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E or the Company) hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

Sanger Unified School District has requested Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) to relocate approximately 1,820 feet of the Sanger-Malaga 115 kV power line and approximately 1,780 feet of the Sanger-California 115 kV power line along Church Avenue in Fresno County to accommodate the construction of a new school complex at the Southeast corner of Church Avenue and Fowler Avenue. The power line relocations begin approximately 450 feet west of the intersection of Fowler Avenue and Church Avenue and proceed eastward along Church to a point approximately 1,400 feet east of the intersection. Four poles on the Sanger-California 115 kV line will be relocated approximately 50 feet south within a new PG&E easement south of Church Avenue, one additional pole will be replaced along the south side of Church Avenue, and a new approximately 30-foot tall wood guy stub pole will be installed north of Church Avenue. The new power poles will be either wood or light duty steel poles approximately 15-20 feet taller than existing poles. In the same area, six existing poles on the Sanger-Malaga 115 kV line will be removed and the line will be relocated approximately 110 feet north and co-located onto the new poles of the Sanger-California 115 kV line; two additional poles on the Sanger-Malaga 115 kV line (one on each side of Church Avenue) approximately 1,320 feet east of the intersection will also be replaced. This

new double-circuit power line will be supported by approximately 5 poles along the south side of Church Avenue. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in spring 2022 or as soon as practicable after project approval. Construction will be completed in summer 2022, or as soon as possible after construction begins.

Exemption from GO 131-D

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. The Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s),

- f. "power lines or substations to be relocated or constructed which have undergone environmental review pursuant to CEQA as part of a larger project, and for which the final CEQA document (Environmental Impact Report (EIR) or Negative Declaration) finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts caused by the proposed line or substation."

The work being proposed entails relocating and consolidating two existing power lines to make way for a school district education facility. The Sanger Unified School District adopted an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for its Educational Center on September 13, 2016 (State Clearinghouse No. 2014121038) and addendum dated October 24, 2017, finding no significant unavoidable environmental impacts resulting from PG&E's proposed relocations.

Details concerning the relocations begin on page 5 in Section 2.2 of the addendum. Neither the EIR nor the addendum identify any significant unavoidable environmental impacts that would result from the relocation of PG&E's utility lines.

Adoption of the addendum also establishes that none of the exceptions to the exemptions in Section III B.2, as specified in CEQA Guidelines section 15300.2, exist to disqualify this project from the NOC process. No significant impacts of any kind were identified for these utility relocations.

This submittal will not cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

The Sanger Unified School District adopted an Environmental Impact Report for the Education Center on September 13, 2016 (State Clearinghouse No. 2014121038) and addendum dated October 24, 2017, finding no significant unavoidable environmental impacts resulting from PG&E's proposed relocations.

- The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

- A clear description of the reason for the protest.
- Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
