Purpose

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby submits for revisions to Electric Schedule E-TOU-C. The affected tariff sheets are listed on the enclosed Attachment 1.

Background

The purpose of this advice letter is to revise Electric Schedule E-TOU-C in PG&E's tariff book to consolidate language that was approved in multiple advice letters.

On June 29, 2020, PG&E submitted advice letter 5860-E to revise Electric Schedule E-TOU-C Tariff Changes per Decision 19-07-004. On August 11, 2020, the CPUC issued a Disposition Letter approving advice letter 5860-E with an effective date of October 1, 2020.¹

On June 18, 2020, PG&E submitted advice letter 6230-E to Electric Medical Baseline Revisions Pursuant to Decision 18-08-013. On July 30, 2021, the Commission issued a Disposition Letter approving advice letter 6230-E with an effective date of October 1, 2020.²

This advice letter does not propose any new modifications to Electric Schedule E-TOU-C. PG&E is merely consolidating tariff language that has already been submitted with and approved by the Commission. For your convenience, PG&E has included redline revisions in Attachment 2.

The submittal would not increase any current rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.
