Subject: Implementation of Decision 21-10-019 on PG&E's Pole Attachment Database System**Purpose**

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) submits this Tier 2 Advice Letter in accordance with Ordering Paragraph 6 of Decision (D.) 21-10-019 regarding PG&E's pole attachment database system. This Advice Letter will describe the specific format by which Attachers shall submit their pole attachment data to PG&E's database system, any additional data points PG&E will require in addition to General Order (GO) 95 Rule 44.4¹ and the expected timeline for implementation of PG&E's database system enabling Attachers to update their attachment information in real-time in compliance with D.21-10-019.

Background

On October 26, 2021 the Commission issued D.21-10-019, its Track 2 Decision Adding Attachment Data To Pole Owner Databases Ordered in Decision 20-07-004. Ordering Paragraph 6 directed the five major pole owners, including PG&E, to file Tier 2 Advice Letters within 60 days following the conclusion of technical workshops, which were to be held within 90 days after the issuance of the Decision. This Tier 2 Advice Letter will address 1) the specific format by which Attachers shall submit their pole attachment data to PG&E's database system; 2) any additional data points PG&E will require in addition to GO 95 Rule 44.4; and 3) the expected timeline for implementation of PG&E's database system enabling Attachers to update their attachment information in real-time.

Format For Attachers To Submit Pole Attachment Data

PG&E developed a data "Template" format that will be used to exchange data between the Attachers and PG&E as the pole owner. The data file format of the Template will be in the comma-separated values (CSV) format. To aid the Attacher in identifying the pole to which its equipment is installed, PG&E will include pole identification data elements in

the Template. Upon receipt of the Template, the Attacher is to insert its attachment data fields to the corresponding PG&E pole record within the Template. The completed Template, incorporating the Attacher's data associated to the correct pole identification number, is then returned to PG&E for processing.

Details on the content of the Template, along with sample data to aid in understanding the expected values in each of the fields, is set forth in Exhibit A.

Whether Any Additional Data Points Will Be Required in Addition to GO 95 Rule 44.4

PG&E will not require additional data points from Attachers in addition to that otherwise required by GO 95 Rule 44.4 when they submit pole attachment data to PG&E's Pole Attachment Database System.

The Expected Timeline for Implementation of PG&E's Database System

PG&E anticipates the design of the database that will be used to receive the Phase 1 Attacher's data will be completed by February 28, 2023. The Attachers are expected to provide their Phase 1 data to PG&E within 12 months of approval of this Tier 2 Advice Letter, which is projected to be on or about May 24, 2023.² PG&E anticipates that it will add the Attacher's Phase 1 data to its database within 12 months, on or about May 23, 2024.³ In addition, following this projected date, May 23, 2024, PG&E will enable integration of regular updates received from Attachers.

Within 90 days after receiving the Attacher's Phase 1 data, the five pole owners will convene a joint workshop or workshops to discuss lessons learned from Phase 1 and provide clarification on the manner for Attachers to provide Phase 2 data.⁴ The projected date for holding this joint workshop is on or about August 21, 2023. A workshop report is to be provided within 90 days following the workshop November 21, 2023. The Attachers are expected to provide their Phase 2 data to PG&E within 12 months of the submission of the joint workshop report, projected to be in or about November 21, 2024.⁵ PG&E anticipates that it will add the Attacher's Phase 2 data to its database within 12 months, which is projected to be by or about November 21, 2025. In addition, following this projected date, November 21, 2025, PG&E will enable integration of regular updates received from Attachers.

This submittal would not increase any current rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.
