Purpose

The purpose of this advice letter is to create the new Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E's) Electric Sample Form 79-1221 – *Agreement To Perform Electric Rule 29 Tariff Schedule Related Work* for customers to establish service under Electric Rule 29.

Background

Assembly Bill (AB) 841 directed the investor-owned utilities (IOUs) to submit advice letters to establish a new Rule that authorizes each IOU to design and deploy all electrical distribution infrastructure on the utility side of the customer's meter for customers installing separately metered infrastructure to support charging stations, other than those in single-family residences.

On February 26, 2021, PG&E submitted Advice 6102-E requesting the establishments of Electric Rules 29, *EV Infrastructure Rule*, and Electric Preliminary Statement Part IU, *AB 841 Memorandum Account*, to track the costs. On March 17, 2021, PG&E submitted Advice 6102-E-A to replace specific pages outline in Advice 6102-E to keep the rule consistent with other utilities. On October 7, 2021, Resolution E-5167 approved, with modifications, PG&E's Advice 6102-E and 6102-E-A.

Under Section B.10 of Electric Rule 29, PG&E requires each applicant to have a written contract to request service prior to PG&E performing its work to establish service. PG&E is creating Electric Sample Form 79-1221 – *Agreement To Perform Electric Rule 29 Tariff Schedule Related Work* for customers to establish service under Electric Rule 29.

Tariff

PG&E is creating Electric Sample Form 79-1221 - *Agreement To Perform Electric Rule 29 Tariff Schedule Related Work*.

Electric Sample Form 79-1221 is designed similar to the existing Gas and Electric Sample Form 62-4527.

The form is intended to spell out minimum qualifying requirements for Rule 29 and collect and memorialize PG&E costs versus those additional costs, if any, assigned to the applicant. It is anticipated that applicants might request service facilities beyond what is allowed under Electric Rule 29 to provide electric service to the qualified EV charging stations. This form details those additional requests, including service points that are beyond what PG&E would normally provide per its standard design (excess service cost), rearrangement of facilities at the applicant's request and undergrounding. These additional costs are consistent with how applicants are charged under Electric Rule 16 and again are in addition to what is provided by the Utility under Electric Rule 29.

Protests

AGREEMENT TO PERFORM ELECTRIC RULE 29 TARIFF SCHEDULE RELATED WORK¹

_____ (Applicant) has requested PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY, a California corporation (PG&E), to perform the tariff schedule related work in accordance with Electric Rule 29 and as located and described in paragraph 5 herein.

PG&E agrees to perform the requested work and furnish all necessary labor, equipment, materials, and related facilities required therefore, subject to the following conditions:

1. Whenever part or all of the requested work is to be furnished or performed upon property other than that of Applicant, Applicant shall first procure from such owners all necessary rights-of-way and/or permits in a form satisfactory to PG&E and without cost to it.
2. Applicant shall indemnify and hold harmless PG&E, its officers, agents and employees, against all loss, damage, expense and liability resulting from injury to or death of any person, including but not limited to, employees of PG&E, Applicant or any third party, or for the loss, destruction or damage to property, including, but not limited to property of PG&E, Applicant or any third party, arising out of or in any way connected with the performance of this agreement, however caused, except to the extent caused by the active negligence or willful misconduct of PG&E, its officers, agents and employees. Applicant will, on PG&E's request, defend any suit asserting a claim covered by this indemnity. Applicant will pay all costs that may be incurred by PG&E in enforcing this indemnity, including reasonable attorneys' fees.
3. The Applicant must activate the initial agreed upon quantity of Charging Stations within 30 business days after service point energization by PG&E (aka: DRS or Date Ready for Service), or on a timeline mutually agreed upon by the Utility and the Applicant, not to exceed 180 business days
4. The Applicant understands that they are responsible for funding and executing the operation and maintenance of the Charging Stations for a minimum of 5 years from the DRS date.
