Purpose

Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E") hereby submits this supplemental Tier 3 Advice Letter ("AL") to supplement AL 6556-E. In its original submittal, PG&E submitted a deviation for the United States Coast Guard – TRACEN Petaluma ("USCG") on PG&E's Electric Rule 21 Filed Form 79-1069-02 - *Generating Facility Interconnection Agreement (Multiple Tariff NEM2MT)*. This supplemental does not make any changes to original AL 6556-E. However, in this supplemental PG&E is including additionally the required update to its *Electric List of Contract and Deviations* tariff for the above form deviation, pursuant to G.O. 96-B Section 9.5.6. PG&E regrets this omission.

Background

On April 6, 2022, PG&E submitted Advice Letter 6556-E requesting approval for a single deviation for USCG on PG&E's Electric Rule 21 Filed Form 79-1069-02 - *Generating Facility Interconnection Agreement (Multiple Tariff NEM2MT)*¹. The deviation requests the addition of one sentence to the Limitation of Liability section, and the deviation is offered pursuant to General Order 96-B, General Rules Sections 3.4², and 9.2.3

pertaining to Service to Government Agencies³, and Energy Industry Rules 5.3(5)⁴. PG&E notes that under Section 9.2.3 *“The utility may begin such service without prior Commission approval, but the utility shall promptly submit an advice letter to the appropriate Industry Division to notify the Commission of the utility’s provision of such service and of the rates, charges, terms and conditions under which the service is provided. Although the advice letter may be effective pending disposition under General Rule 7.5.3, the Commission may determine, in an appropriate proceeding, the reasonableness of such service.”*

Form 79-1069-02 is used for interconnecting multiple types of customer owned generation that each are subject to different tariffs, and where at least one of the generators is eligible for Schedule NEM2 (collective called NEM2MT, as described in Special Condition 4 in the NEM2 tariff). USCG is proposing to execute this agreement for a project it has.

Tariff Revisions

PG&E is modifying Sheet 27 of the Electric List Contracts and Deviations as shown in Attachment 1.

Protests

Pursuant to GO 96-B, General Rule 7.5.1, PG&E requests to maintain the original protest and comment period designated in Advice 6556-E and not reopen the protest period.

...

At all times, a utility other than a telephone corporation may provide service (other than resale service) to a government agency for free, or at reduced rates and charges, or under terms and conditions otherwise deviating from its tariffs then in effect. The utility may begin such service without prior Commission approval, but the utility shall promptly submit an advice letter to the appropriate Industry Division to notify the Commission of the utility’s provision of such service and of the rates, charges, terms and conditions under which the service is provided. Although the advice letter may be effective pending disposition under General Rule 7.5.3, the Commission may determine, in an appropriate proceeding, the reasonableness of such service.

For purposes of this General Rule 9.2.3, “government agency” means the United States and its departments, Indian tribes recognized by the United States or the State of California, the State of California and its political subdivisions and municipal corporations, including the departments thereof, and public fairs and celebrations. Effective Date

Pursuant to G.O. 96-B, Rule 5.3, this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 3 designation. PG&E requests that this Tier 3 advice submittal become effective concurrent with original Advice Letter 6556-E, which is effective upon Commission approval.

As mentioned previously per G.O. 96-B, General Rule 9.2.3, *Emergency Service; Service to Government Agencies* (see footnote 2), PG&E requests that this tariff become effective concurrent with the tariff submitted in AL 6556-E, and the USCG may begin such service without prior Commission approval on April 6, 2022. PG&E is promptly submitting this advice letter to notify the Commission of the utility's provision of such service and of the rates, charges, terms, and conditions under which the service is provided. Although the advice letter may be effective pending disposition under General Rule 7.5.3, the Commission may determine, in an appropriate proceeding, the reasonableness of such service.
