Subject: Pacific Gas & Electric's Interim Rate Relief Wildfire Mitigation and Catastrophic Events, A.20-02-003 Reconciliation of Revenues Collected Through June 30, 2022

In Decision 20-10-026, the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) approved Pacific Gas & Electric Company's (PG&E) request to recover, on an interim basis and subject to refund, \$447 million in revenue associated with the memorandum accounts reflected in Application 20-02-003.

PG&E hereby submits a reconciliation (Appendix A) for the period ending June 30, 2022 in accordance with Ordering Paragraph (OP) 4. This reconciliation of the interim revenues collected for each wildfire memorandum account verifies that interim recovery appropriately excludes return on equity of capital expenditures.

Background

In Decision 20-10-026, the CPUC authorized PG&E to recover, on an interim basis and subject to refund, \$447 million in revenue over a period commencing December 2020 and continuing through April 2022¹ associated with the wildfire mitigation related memorandum accounts reflected in Application 20-02-003. The wildfire memorandum accounts are the Fire Hazard Prevention Memorandum Account (FHPMA), Fire Risk Mitigation Memorandum Account (FRMMA), and the Wildfire Mitigation Plan Memorandum Account (WMPMA).

OP 4 requires PG&E to submit a reconciliation report for the periods ending each June 30 and December 31, showing the revenues collected for the memorandum accounts reconciled against the reductions made in other dockets.

¹ Should PG&E begin recovery after December 2020, the end of the recovery period shall be extended commensurately. PG&E began collecting interim rate relief revenues in January of 2021.
