**Subject: Retire Electric Preliminary Statement Part DG, Power Charge Collection Balancing Account**

**Purpose**

As part of periodic reviews of its tariff book, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) has identified an obsolete account. Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) submits this Tier 2 advice letter to retire Electric Preliminary Statement Part DG, Power Charge Collection Balancing Account (PCCBA).

The affected tariff sheets are provided in Attachment 1.

**Retire Electric Preliminary Statement Part DG**

Power Charge Collection Balancing Account (PCCBA)

Decision (D.) 04-01-028 authorized PG&E to establish the PCCBA to track the difference between amounts collected by PG&E from the PCCBA rate component and remittances to DWR. In 2015, DWR determined that all necessary Power Charges had been collected from the IOUs' electricity customers. As a result, D.15-12-003 established a statewide negative revenue requirement of \$58 million to return excess power charges to customers, \$38 million of which was allocated to PG&E.<sup>1</sup> Decision 21-12-001, which addresses the overcollection of DWR bond charges and future energy crisis litigation monies, reaffirmed the conclusion in D.15-12-003 that "all monies required to be collected pursuant to the DWR Power Charges and Bond Charges have been fully collected by the IOUs and remitted to DWR."<sup>2</sup> Upon approval of this advice letter, PG&E proposes to

transfer the final remaining balance in the PCCBA<sup>3</sup> to the Energy Resource Recovery Account (ERRA) and retire the PCCBA as this account is no longer required. The rate associated with the PCCBA as defined in Electric Preliminary Statement Part I will be addressed in PG&E's 2023 Annual Electric True-Up (AET) Advice Letter, which is also being submitted on November 15, 2022.
