**Purpose**

The purpose of this Tier 1 advice letter is to establish Pacific Gas and Electric's (PG&E) Click-Through Process Memorandum Account (CTPMA) in compliance with Ordering Paragraph (OP) 2 of the California Public Utilities Commission's (CPUC or the Commission) Decision (D.) 23-09-006.

**Background**

On November 26, 2018, PG&E filed Application (A.)18-11-015, *Application of Pacific Gas & Electric Company for Approval of Cost Recovery and Improvements to Its Click-Through Process*, in compliance with OP 29 of Resolution (Res.) E-4868.

On September 28, 2023, the Commission issued D. 23-09-006, *Decision Approving Click-Through Enhancement Applications*, which directed PG&E to establish a memorandum account as its Click-Through Process enhancements cost recovery mechanism.<sup>1</sup>

PG&E expects to incur incremental operational expenses and incremental capital expenditures to implement the scope of improvements to PG&E's Click Through process as approved in D.23-09-006. PG&E's accounting policies will be applied to the incremental costs recorded to the CTPMA to determine expense or capitalization treatment. PG&E has included in the preliminary statements attached to this advice letter accounting procedures to allow both expense and capitalized costs to be recorded into the CTPMA to support the implementation of the Click Through process enhancements.

Disposition of the balance in the memorandum account will be addressed in a future general rate case (GRC) proceeding, or other application or proceeding.

1. **PURPOSE:** The purpose of the Click-Through Process Memorandum Account (CTPMA) is to track incremental costs associated with enhancements to the Click-Through Process pursuant to Decision 23-09-006.
2. **APPLICABILITY:** The CTPMA applies to all electric customers, except for those specifically excluded by the Commission.
3. **REVISION DATE:** Disposition of the balance in will be addressed in a future general rate case (GRC) proceeding, or other application or proceeding.
4. **RATES:** The CTPMA does not have a rate component.
5. **ACCOUNTING PROCEDURE:** PG&E will maintain the CTPMA by making the following entries, net of Revenue Fees and Uncollectibles (RF&U), to the account at the end of each month, or as applicable:
  - a. A debit entry equal to the actual incremental expenses;
  - b. A debit or credit entry equal to the capital revenue requirement associated with actual incremental capital costs incurred. Capital-related revenue requirements include depreciation expense, return on investment, federal and state income taxes, and property taxes associated with the costs of installed equipment;
  - c. A debit or credit entry, as appropriate, to record the transfer of amounts to or from other accounts as approved by the Commission;
  - d. A debit or credit, as appropriate, equal to interest on the average balance in the account at the beginning of the month and the balance after the above entries, at the rate equal to one-twelfth of the interest rate on three-month Commercial Paper for the previous month, as reported in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, H.15 or its successor.
