Purpose

In compliance with California Public Utilities Commission (“Commission” or “CPUC”) Resolution E-5439 Ordering Paragraph (“OP”) 4, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (“PG&E”) respectfully submits this Tier 2 advice letter to provide a modified agreement, in accordance with Resolution E-5439, with Microsoft Corporation (“Microsoft”) regarding a data center project located at 1657 Alviso-Milpitas Road, San Jose, CA 95134 (“Project”).

Background

Microsoft submitted an electric service application to PG&E requesting electric load demands at full build of 90 megawatt (“MW”) for a data center facility to be located in San Jose, CA.

PG&E submitted an advice letter on July 1, 2025, to address the unique circumstances presented by Microsoft’s request for new electric transmission service facilities for transmission load.

On December 12, 2025, the CPUC Energy Division issued Draft Resolution E-5439, approving the Advice Letter with modification.

On January 2, 2026, PG&E filed comments in response to the Draft Resolution.

On January 20, 2026, the Commission issued Resolution E-5439, approving the Advice Letter with modification. According to OP 2 of Resolution E-5439, “PG&E shall modify the refund process in the Agreement to Perform Tariff Schedule Related Work to limit annual refunds to the Microsoft project to 75 percent of the annual net revenues PG&E collected from Microsoft in that year, adjusting for the Income Tax Component of Contribution (ITCC) as set forth above. In this case, the term ‘net revenues’ refers to the transmission component of Microsoft’s electric rates and the per meter customer charge.”

OP 3 of Resolution E-5439 directed PG&E to “extend the period in which Microsoft is eligible to receive a refund for upfront energization costs from 10 years to 15 years.”

OP 4 of Resolution E-5439 directed PG&E to “seek approval for the modified Agreement to Perform Tariff Schedule Related Work through a Tier 1 Advice Letter.” Because the modified Agreement includes additional provisions beyond those expressly directed in Resolution E-5439, PG&E has submitted this as a Tier 2 Advice Letter.

Principal Revisions to Provisions in the Agreement

PG&E is including with this Advice Letter a redline and a clean version of the Agreement to Perform Tariff Schedule Related Work with Microsoft (“Modified Agreement”). These changes are in Exhibits B and C of the Agreement to Perform Tariff Schedule Related Work with Microsoft, and reflect the Commission’s direction to (a) extend the refund period to 15 years (Resolution E-5439, OP 3) and (b) limit refunds to 75 percent of annual net revenues, adjusting for ITCC” (Resolution E-5439, OP 2). In accordance with Resolution E-5439, “Annual Net Revenues” are defined as “the transmission rate components of the Applicant’s energy bills, and excludes items such as energy, public purpose programs, non-bypassable charges, revenue cycle services, and other revenues that do not support the components of Applicant’s bill specifically related to transmission costs and infrastructure.” Exhibit C of the Agreement to Perform Tariff Schedule Related Work with Microsoft also includes two additional contractual provisions concerning Consequential Damages and Limitation of Liability. These provisions concern only damages arising from the Agreement, are agreed to by the parties, and are intended to protect existing ratepayers.

Because the Modified Agreement includes confidential and proprietary customer information, Attachments 1 and 2 have been marked confidential.

This submittal would not increase any current rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.
