Subject: Pacific Gas and Electric Company's Medium-Large Commercial and Industrial COVID-19 Disconnection Moratorium Quarterly Report, Pursuant to D.21-04-015, Ordering Paragraph 2

Purpose

Pursuant to Ordering Paragraph (OP) 2 of California Public Utilities Commission (Commission or CPUC) Decision (D.) 21-04-015, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) submits this advice letter (AL) to summarize the number of medium-large commercial and industrial customers participating in the COVID-19 disconnection moratorium and reporting the financial amount of the under-collected and unpaid bills that have accrued.

Background

On April 15, 2021 the Commission issued D. 21-04-015, which established a disconnection moratorium in response to the COVID-19 pandemic for medium-large commercial and industrial customers. The Commission clarified that the moratorium would run from December 30, 2020 through June 30, 2021 and cover customers enrolled and current in a payment plan within 75 days of the effective date of the Decision. D.21-04-015 also requires PG&E to submit a Tier 1 advice letter within 15 days of the last day of each quarter to summarize the medium-large commercial and industrial customers participating in the disconnection moratorium and reporting the financial amount of the under-collected and unpaid bills that have accrued.¹

In addition, D.21-04-015 clarifies that “should the residential and small business COVID-19 protections adopted in Resolution(s) M-4842 and M-4849 be extended beyond June 30, 2021, the memorandum accounts for medium-large commercial and industrial customers adopted here shall be extended for the same length of

time, by the same order.² In D.21-06-036, the Commission directed PG&E to continue to suspend disconnections for nonpayment until September 30, 2021.³ Accordingly, PG&E extended the end date for the Medium-Large Commercial and Industrial COVID-19 Disconnection Moratorium Memorandum Account through September 30, 2021.

Discussion

PG&E provides the data required by D.21-04-015, OP 2 in Table 1 below.
