Subject: Pacific Gas and Electric's 2021 Unspent and Uncommitted Energy Efficiency Funds Applicable to AB 841 Schools Energy Efficiency Stimulus Program.

Purpose

In accordance with Ordering Paragraph (OP) 3 of Decision (D.) 21-01-004, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) hereby submits to the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC or Commission) this Advice Letter (AL) to detail its 2021 unspent and uncommitted energy efficiency funds for the Assembly Bill (AB) 841 Schools Energy Efficiency Stimulus Program.

Background

Decision (D.) 21-01-004 established directions to the investor-owned utilities (IOUs), including Pacific Gas and Electric Company, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, Southern California Edison Company and Southern California Gas Company, for funding the School Energy Efficiency Stimulus Program (SEESP) administered by the California Energy Commission (CEC). Unspent and uncommitted energy efficiency (EE) funds for program years 2020, 2021 and 2022 constitute a portion of the funds to be transferred to the CEC for administration of the SEESP.

Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) Kao, via email ruling, directed the IOUs to each submit a Tier 2 advice letter no later than April 1, 2022, to provide an updated amount of program year 2021 unspent and uncommitted funds from the amount that was estimated in each IOU's 2022-2023 Budget Advice Letter submitted January 7, 2022.

On March 11, 2022, pursuant to Rule 11.6 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, the IOUs filed a joint email requesting an extension for the submittal of the Tier 2 advice letter from March 1 to March 15, 2022. On March 14, 2022, ALJ Kao granted the IOUs' request.

Finally, the email ruling directed each IOU to disburse to the CEC its applicable 2021 unspent and uncommitted funds in a single lump sum after being invoiced by the CEC.

Discussion

Pursuant to ALJ Kao's email ruling on December 17, 2021, and D.21-01-004 Ordering Paragraph 3, PG&E respectfully submits the EE PY 2021 unspent and uncommitted funds (Table 1) to be disbursed to the CEC for administration of the SEESP. PG&E's PY 2021 unspent and uncommitted funds amount to \$29.5 million.
