Subject: Pacific Gas and Electric Company's request to update its Wildfire Expense Memorandum Account (WEMA) tariffs

Purpose

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) submits this Tier 2 Advice Letter to clarify that its WEMA tariffs include 1) claims arising from damage caused by mudslides resulting from a wildfire and 2) claims by a governmental entity. Proposed tariff clarifications are included in Attachment 1 to this advice letter.

Background

On July 26, 2017, PG&E filed its WEMA Application (A.17-07-011) requesting authorization to establish a memorandum account for tracking incremental unreimbursed wildfire liability costs. On June 22, 2018, the Commission issued D.18-06-029, which established the WEMA as an ongoing account, not limited to a particular wildfire event.

The purpose of the WEMA is "to record all costs of third-party claims paid by Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) resulting from wildfires that would have been covered by insurance, as well as costs that would not have been incurred if insurance were available, including: (1) payments to satisfy wildfire claims, including any deductibles, co-insurance and other insurance expense paid by PG&E, but excluding costs that have already been authorized in PG&E's General Rate Case (GRC);(2) outside legal costs incurred in the defense of wildfire claims; (3) premium costs not in rates; and (4) the cost of financing these amounts."¹

Through this advice letter, PG&E requests approval to update its WEMA tariffs to clarify the definition of "wildfire claims" to include 1) claims arising from damage caused by mudslides that are alleged to have resulted from a wildfire and 2) claims by a government

entity for the reimbursement of fire suppression costs, damages to environmental resources and other governmental claims against PG&E arising from a wildfire.

PG&E believes that such claims already fall within the scope of the current WEMA tariffs, which authorizes PG&E to record “all costs of third-party claims paid by Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) resulting from wildfires.” As such, this request is intended to clarify that mudslide claims alleged to have been caused by wildfires and governmental entity claims are included within the scope of the tariffs for the avoidance of doubt. The additional clarification PG&E proposes to include in its WEMA tariffs is consistent with the Commission-approved language for Southern California Edison Company in D.18-11-051, which specifically includes mudslide claims and governmental entity claims within the definition of Wildfire Claims. It is also consistent with the AB 1054 Wildfire Fund memorandum of coverage, which specifically references claims for such mudslide events.

Tariff Revisions

As discussed above, PG&E modifies Electric Preliminary Statement Part HL, Wildfire Expenses Memorandum Account (WEMA-E) and Gas Preliminary Statement Part EE, Wildfire Expenses Memorandum Account (WEMA-G) to specifically include mudslides that are alleged to have resulted from a wildfire and governmental entity claims within the definition of “Wildfire Claim” as used in the tariff. Clean and redline copies of the preliminary statements are provided in attachments to this advice letter.
