Subject: Annual Update regarding Pacific Gas and Electric Company's Climate Vulnerability Assessment

Purpose

In accordance with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC or Commission) Decision (D.) 20-08-046 (the "Decision"), Ordering Paragraph 13, Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E") hereby provides an annual update regarding progress on PG&E's Climate Resilience Team.

Background

On August 27, 2020, the CPUC issued D.20-08-046 "Decision on Energy Utility Climate Change Vulnerability Assessments and Climate Adaptation in Disadvantaged Communities (Phase 1, Topics 4 and 5)." D.20-08-046, Ordering Paragraph 13 requires:

"The IOUs shall annually, at the end of the first quarter of each calendar year, file and serve on the service list of this proceeding (or successor proceeding) a Tier 1 Advice Letter with the Commission's Energy Division listing the individuals with their departments on the IOU's climate change team and the name of the senior level executive to whom the climate change team directly reports. The annual Tier 1 Advice letter shall include a status update that describes the activities of the climate change team in the last year and anticipated upcoming milestones that will lead up to the next vulnerability assessment filing."

Climate Resilience Team Structure, Reporting, and Oversight

PG&E's Climate Resilience Team is part of the Electric Asset Management group within the Company's **Strategy and Growth** organization. The following employees currently represent PG&E's core Climate Resilience Team, comprised of senior level executives, responsible managers, and primary Climate Resilience Team staff:

- Jason Glickman, Executive Vice President, Strategy and Growth
- Joe Bentley, Senior Vice President, Electric Engineering
- Jim Gill, Senior Director, Electric Asset Management

- Nathan Bengtsson, Senior Manager, Climate Resilience Team
- Eric Kuhle, Principal, Climate Resilience Team
- Patrick Moore, Principal, Climate Resilience Team
- Maegan Cowan, Expert, Climate Resilience Team
- Revathi Muralidharan, Climate Data Steward, Climate Resilience Team

In addition to the accountability and oversight provided by PG&E's Lean daily operating review procedures, PG&E's Climate Resilience Team is accountable to multiple senior governance bodies. This includes:

- PG&E's Climate Resilience Team continues to report annually to the PG&E Board of Directors' Sustainability and Governance (S&G) Committee, which is co-chaired by Director Jessica Denecour, with President of PG&E Corporation, Executive Vice President of Customer and Corporate Affairs Carla Peterman and Executive Vice President John Simon as lead officers.¹ In September 2025, the Climate Resilience Team presented to the S&G Committee on the top mitigation and controls reducing climate change impacts.
- Quarterly reporting requirements to the Electric Risk and Compliance Committee on the newly developed Climate Change Key Risk Indicators for sea level rise, extreme heat, major storms, and the state's hydrology conditions.
- The Climate Resilience Team also presented to the Wildfire Risk Governance Committee about the proposed approach to address Wildfire in the Company's 2027 Climate Adaptation Vulnerability Assessment (CAVA) and to ensure consistency with ongoing Wildfire Mitigation Plan activities.

Status Update in the Activities of the Climate Resilience Team

The Climate Resilience Team is continuing to mature the climate resilience function to deepen the integration of climate change risk considerations into company processes. This includes:

- Updating multiple electric engineering design standards using climate change projections as part of the ongoing Climate-Informed Design Guidance program.
- Development of climate-informed system planning electric load forecasting assumptions using newly available hourly climate projections from the State's Fifth Climate Assessment.
- The filing of PG&E's Climate Pilot White Paper as part of the Phase III Risk Based Decision Making Framework Order Instituting Rulemaking pursuant to D.24-05-064.
- Completing multiple pilot projects to incorporate forward-looking climate projections into various risk models to assess the impact of changing weather conditions to asset failures and debris flows.

- Ongoing participation in the Climate Change Adaptation Order Instituting Rulemaking proceeding, including participating in:
 - The April 2025 Workshop on Climate Adaptation in General Orders hosted by the CPUC's Safety and Policy Division;
 - The Lexicon Working Group, where, together with the California Joint investor-owned utilities (IOUs), hosted a workshop in July 2025 and filed the Lexicon Working Group report in August 2025; and
 - The August 2025 Climate Adaptation Equity Workshop hosted by the CPUC's Energy Division.

Information regarding PG&E's 2027 Climate Adaptation Vulnerability Assessment and Community Engagement Activities

CPUC D.24-08-005 modified both the analytical framework and timing of future Community Engagement Plans (CEP) and large IOU CAVAs. Regarding activities from April 2025 to March 2026, the Company has undertaken the following key efforts:

- Entered two consulting engagements to support the company in meeting (1) Community Engagement requirements and (2) project management and analytical support for the 2027 CAVA.
- Began work on the 2026 Community Engagement Plan, which will be filed in May 2026.
- Reinstated the Resilient Together Advisory Groups (RTAGs) to support community outreach and engagement activities.
- Continued work on the 2027 CAVA, including the development of a new approach and methodology to be consistent with new IOU CAVA requirements associated with D.24-08-005.
- Developed new climate change analysis, consistent with D.24-08-005, using the Global Warming Target Level framework.
