Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E" or "the Company") hereby submits notice pursuant to General Order (G.O.) 131-D, Section XI, Subsection B.4, of the construction of facilities that are exempt from a Permit to Construct.

Purpose

This advice letter provides a copy of the Notice of Proposed Construction (Attachment I) and the Notice Distribution List, which comply with the noticing requirements found in G.O. 131-D, Section XI.

Background

To continue to meet current and future electrical demand in eastern Tulare County, PG&E proposes to replace the existing wires (conductors) with new wires (reconductor) on approximately 2 miles of PG&E's existing Reedley - Orosi 70 kV Power Line (existing franchise). The project begins at Orosi Substation at the intersection of Road 144 and Avenue 416 in unincorporated Tulare County. The project continues north along Road 144 through agricultural lands for approximately 2 miles, and ends at the intersection of Road 144 and Avenue 432. To support the new wires, PG&E proposes to replace approximately 26 wood poles, approximately 35 to 60 feet in height, with new wood or light-duty steel poles. Most of the replacement poles will be approximately the same height or up to 15 feet taller than the existing poles to comply with California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) General Order 95 minimum clearance requirements and to reduce electric and magnetic fields at ground level near rural residences. Approximately 7 replacement poles will be approximately 20 to 25 feet taller than the existing poles to meet current design standards for switches, vertical framing configurations, and CPUC General Order 95 requirements. One new light-duty steel pole will be installed in the existing alignment to accommodate existing distribution service lines. The project spans but avoids an overflow channel of the Friant-Kern Canal. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in January 2018, or as soon as project plans and approvals are in place. Construction will be completed in March 2018, or as soon as possible after construction begins.

CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1, exempts projects meeting specific conditions from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct. The Company believes this project qualifies for the following exemption(s):

g. "power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR [Environmental Impact Report] finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts."

This filing will not cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any other rate schedule or rule.

Protests

Anyone wishing to protest this filing may do so by filing a protest with the CPUC and the Company by November 30, 2016, which is 20 days after the date of this filing. Protests should be mailed to the following address:

The Company requests that this Tier 2 advice filing become effective on December 10, 2016, which is 30 days after the date of filing. (In accordance with G.O. 131-D, construction will not begin until 45 days after notice is first published.)

Proposed Project: To continue to meet current and future electrical demand in eastern Tulare County, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) proposes to replace the existing wires (conductors) with new wires (reconductor) on approximately 2 miles of PG&E's existing Reedley - Orosi 70 kV Power Line (existing franchise). Electric and Magnetic Fields (EMF): PG&E will employ "no cost" and specified "low cost" measures to reduce public exposure to EMF in accordance with California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) Decision 06-01-042 and the "EMF Design Guidelines for Electrical Facilities" prepared in compliance with that decision. The following measures are proposed for this project:

 Increase the height of overhead lines, more than otherwise required, to reduce EMF strength at ground level near rural residences.

Exemption from CPUC Permit Requirement: CPUC General Order 131-D, Section III, Subsection B.1, exempts a utility from the CPUC's requirement to file an application requesting authority to construct if a project meets specific conditions. This project qualifies for the following exemption:

g. "power line facilities or substations to be located in an existing franchise, road-widening setback easement, or public utility easement; or in a utility corridor designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted pursuant to law by federal, state, or local agencies for which a final Negative Declaration or EIR [Environmental Impact Report] finds no significant unavoidable environmental impacts."

- b. The cumulative impact of successive projects of the same type in the same place, over time, is significant; or
- c. There is a reasonable possibility that the activity will have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances.

Protests should include the following:

- 1. Your name, mailing address and daytime telephone number.
- 2. Reference to the CPUC Advice Letter Number and Project Name.
- 3. A clear description of the reason for the protest.
- 4. Whether you believe that evidentiary hearings are necessary to resolve factual disputes.
