Public Utilities Commission of the State of California

Subject Establish Z-Factor Memorandum Accounts

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) submits for filing revisions to its gas and electric tariffs. The affected preliminary statements are listed in the enclosed Attachment 1.

Purpose

Pursuant to the Commission's decisions in PG&E's 2014 General Rate Case (GRC) and 2015 Gas Tranmission and Storage (GT&S) proccedings, PG&E requests the Commission's authority to establish the gas 1 and electric 2 Z-Factor Memorandum Accounts (ZFMA).

The memorandum accounts record and track costs associated with events that are potential "Z-Factors" and that represent exogenous and unforeseen events largely beyond PG&E's control that have a material impact on PG&E's costs.

Background

Decision (D.) 14-08-032, OP 41, in PG&E's last GRC and D.16-06-056, OP 56, approving joint stipulation³ in PG&E's most recent GT&S rate case authorized PG&E to use a Z-factor process for recovering certain exogenous costs during the GRC and GT&S post test year periods. Z-Factors are unforeseen events largely beyond PG&E's control that have a material impact on PG&E's costs. Each Z-Factor event is subject to a \$10 million deductible.

Tariffs Revisions

1. Establish Gas Preliminary Statement Part DU - Z-Factor Memorandum Account (ZFMA-G); and

2. Establish Electric Preliminary Statement Part GU – Z-Factor Memorandum Account (ZFMA-E).

This filing will not increase any current rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.

Protests

Anyone wishing to protest this filing may do so by letter by August 10, 2016, which is 20 days from the date of this filing. Z-Factors are exogenous and unforeseen events largely beyond PG&E's control that have a material impact on PG&E's costs (See D. 14-08-032, OP 41 and D. 16-06-056, OP 56.) Each Z-Factor event is subject to a \$10 million deductible.
- APPLICABILITY: The ZFMA will apply to all customer classes, except for those specifically excluded by the Commission. The Z-Factor only applies to the post-testyear period.
- REVISION DATES: Disposition of the balance in this account will be determined in an application or as otherwise determined by the CPUC.
- RATES: The ZFMA does not have a separate rate component.
- ACCOUNTING PROCEDURE: The following entries, net of an allowance for Franchise Fees and Uncollectible Accounts Expense (F&U), will be made each month, as applicable:
 - A debit entry equal to the actual Z-Factor costs related to the corresponding event incurred for the current month.
 - An entry to transfer amounts to or from other accounts as authorized by the Commission.
 - An entry equal to the interest on the average balance in the account at the beginning of the month and the balance after the above entries, at a rate equal to one-twelfth of the interest rate on three-month Commercial Paper for the previous month, as reported in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, H.15 or its successor.
