



**GAS SCHEDULE GT
MOBILEHOME PARK SERVICE**

Sheet 1

APPLICABILITY: This rate schedule* applies to natural gas service to Core End-Use Customers on PG&E's Transmission and/or Distribution Systems. To qualify, service must be master-metered for residential use in a mobilehome park multifamily accommodations through one meter on a single premises and submetered to all individual tenants in accordance with Rule 18. This schedule is closed to the new mobilehome parks and manufactured housing communities for which construction commenced after January 1, 1997.

TERRITORY: Schedule GT applies everywhere within PG&E's natural gas Service Territory.

RATES: Customers on this schedule pay a Procurement Charge and a Transportation Charge, per meter, as follows:

Public Purpose Program Surcharge:

Customers served under this schedule are subject to a gas Public Purpose Program (PPP) Surcharge under Schedule G-PPPS.

Discount (Per installed space per day): \$0.48200

The master-meter/submeter rate discount provided herein prohibits further recovery by mobilehome park owners for the costs of owning, operating and maintaining their gas submetered system. This prohibition also includes the cost of the replacement of the submetered gas system. This provision was authorized in Ordering Paragraph 4 of CPUC Decision 95-02-090, dated February 22, 1995.

The Procurement Charge on this schedule is equivalent to the rate shown on informational Schedule G-CP—Gas Procurement Service to Core End-Use Customers.

BASELINE QUANTITIES: The above rates are applicable only to residential use. PG&E may require the Customer to submit a completed "Declaration of Eligibility for Baseline Quantities for Residential Rates." The delivered quantities of gas shown below are billed at the rates for baseline use.

SEASONAL CHANGES: The summer season is April 1 through October 31, and the winter season is November 1 through March 31. Baseline quantities for bills that include the April 1 and November 1 seasonal changeover dates will be calculated by multiplying the applicable daily baseline quantity for each season by the number of days in each season for the billing period.

STANDARD MEDICAL QUANTITIES: Additional medical quantities (Code M) are available as provided in Rule 19.

RESIDENTIAL DWELLING UNITS: It is the responsibility of the Customer to advise PG&E within fifteen (15) days following any change in the number of installed mobile home spaces being served under this rate schedule.

SURCHARGES: Customers served under this schedule in conjunction with Schedule G-CT, or in conjunction with noncore service, are subject to a franchise fee surcharge under Schedule G-SUR for gas volumes purchased from parties other than PG&E and transported by PG&E.

Customers served under this schedule are subject to a gas Public Purpose Program (PPP) Surcharge under Schedule G-PPPS.

ALTERNATIVE PROCUREMENT OPTIONS: Customers may procure gas supply from a party other than PG&E by taking service on this schedule in conjunction with Schedule G-CT—Core Gas Aggregation Service. Customers who procure their own gas supply will not pay the Procurement Charge component of this rate schedule shown above and will be subject to the applicable rates specified in Schedule G-CT.

**BILLING
CALCULATION
SERVICES:**

Customers choosing to enroll in this optional service must first complete a Bill Calculation Service Agreement (Form 79-1104). Customers served under the provisions of Rate Schedule GT may elect to have PG&E provide bill calculation services, to assist them in determining their submetered tenant's utility charges. To utilize PG&E bill calculation services, the customer must create a user account at www.pge.com and agree to provide the following information: tenant's identification number or address, tenant's rate schedule, tenant's billing period (beginning and ending dates of 33 days or less), tenant's beginning and ending meter reads via a secure internet interface described in Form 79-1104. Customers choosing to have PG&E perform bill calculation services for a mobile home park or manufactured housing community are subject to the following charges:

* The Actual labor charge will be determined by multiplying the employee(s) hourly rate for each job by the number of hours worked (to the closest one quarter hour), plus materials cost, if applicable. Hourly personnel rates are available upon request.
